AMENDMENT

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Description:

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Too many government Employees are dishonest and engage in acts that protect each other, including falsifying records. This amendment holds the employee and employer accountable. Honest citizens of the State of Arizona are being injured by these employees and their code of silence.

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AN INITIATIVE MEASURE

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REDEFINING POLITICAL POWER IN THE ARIZONA CONSTITUTION, 2012: 51
ARTICLE II, SECTION 2.

Be it enacted by the People of Arizona:

1. Article II, Section 2, Constitution of Arizona is proposed to be amended as follows, if approved by the voters and on proclamation of the Governor.
2. The Secretary of State shall submit this proposition to the voters at the next general election as provided by Article XXI, Constitution of Arizona.

GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEE ACCOUNTABILITY AND HONESTY
AMENDMENT

TEXT OF THE AMENDMENT

Section 2.3 Political Power and Governmental Employee Accountability.

- a) Every employee of the State of Arizona shall be held accountable and liable for the wrongs they engaged in, liability in tort, and for violations of other laws that exists against every state employee to the same extent as any person not employed by the state.
- b) No employee of the State of Arizona shall be entitled to any form of immunity for actions taken by that employee.
- c) Every state employee shall report other employees who have engaged in misconducts. Failure to report such misconducts shall result in liability as if that employee engaged in the acts themselves.
- d) To prevail in claims against employees of the State of Arizona, the claimant need only produce slight evidence that the allegations are true.
- e) The supervisors of the employee as well as the agency that employed the individual shall also be held liable to the same extent as the employee.
- f) No exhaustion of state or agency remedy or claim needs to be filed in order to maintain a claim under this section.
- g) No prior judgment, criminal conviction or prior decision shall act as a bar to any claim or claims.
- h) Those accused shall not be allowed to invoke any privileges, shall be orally deposed and the state shall produce all the records in the matter including allegations that may fall under Arizona rules of evidence 404, 406, and 801.

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- i) The allegations shall be decided not by a judge and not by way of motion, but by a majority of a jury of twelve.
- j) These provisions are retroactive to January 1, 1980.
- k) The State of Arizona, counties within the State of Arizona, and cities within the State of Arizona shall all be liable under this section.
- l) Employees, attorneys, agents, and agencies referred to in sub-paragraph above shall all be liable under these provisions.

- m) Members of the judicial branch including those elected, shall be liable.
- n) State, county, and city law enforcement including correctional staff shall be liable.
- o) If any provisions are found invalid, other provisions shall survive.
- p) Laws that conflict with any of these provisions shall be deemed as invalid.
- q) If it is proven by some evidence that any Elected Official introduced legislation after January 1, 1980 at the behest of a Political Donor, that legislation shall be void and the Elected Official guilty of violating these provisions, unless and until the legislation discloses the fact that the legislation was introduced at the behest of the Political Donor.

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Summary Employee Accountability

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Legislators in Arizona accept gifts from special interest groups to promulgate laws. Most laws promulgated by legislators accepting gifts, do not benefit Arizonan's public employees in Arizona's cover-up for each other.

There is a rise in misconduct by public employees. This in turn cost the people a lot of money in taxes.

The purpose of this Amendment is to bring honesty in our government.

All public employees elected and appointed will be held responsible for what they do. We need an open honest government.

This is retroactive to January 1,1980.

If public employees are held accountable, they will be more likely to think before acting.
