The Secretary of State's Office has completed its final review in accordance with A.R.S. § 19.121.04(A) and issues the following findings:

- The Secretary of State's Office rejected 639 petition sheets containing 7,274 petition signatures pursuant to A.R.S. § 19-121.01(A)(1). The Secretary of State's office rejected an additional 1,158 petition signatures pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 19-121.01(A)(2)-(3).
- The Secretary of State's Office determined the remaining petition sheets contained 249,484 eligible signatures pursuant to A.R.S. § 19-121.01(A)(6).
- The Secretary of State's Office conducted a 5% random sample of eligible signatures on July 21, 2016 pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 19-121.01(B)-(C) and selected 12,475 total signatures for county recorder verification.
- The county recorders reported the following results from the random sample pursuant to A.R.S. § 19-121.02(B):
 - Apache County found that 4 petition signers were qualified electors and 4 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Cochise County found that 50 petition signers were qualified electors and 15 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Coconino County found that 545 petition signers were qualified electors and 105 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Gila County found that 29 petition signers were qualified electors and 4 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Graham County found that 4 petition signers were qualified electors and 2 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Greenlee County found that 1 petition signers were qualified electors and 0 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - La Paz County found that 1 petition signers were qualified electors and 0 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Maricopa County found that 5,710 petition signers were qualified electors and 2,651 petition signers were not qualified electors.

- Mohave County found that 55 petition signers were qualified electors and 8 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Navajo County found that 46 petition signers were qualified electors and 12 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Pima County found that 1,966 petition signers were qualified electors and 681 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Pinal County found that 131 petition signers were qualified electors and 44 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Santa Cruz County found that 38 petition signers were qualified electors and 8 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Yavapai County found that 209 petition signers were qualified electors and 51 petition signers were not qualified electors.
 - Yuma County found that 76 petition signers were qualified electors and 25 petition signers were not qualified electors.
- To qualify for the ballot, the county recorders were required to validate at least 7,681 total signatures with no worse than a 38.4% signature failure rate.
 - The county recorders validated 8,864 signatures and disqualified 3,611 signatures, resulting in a 28.95% signature failure rate.
 - Pursuant to A.R.S. § 19-121.04(A), the estimated total number of valid signatures is 177,258, which exceeds the 150,642 minimum signatures to qualify for the ballot under the Arizona Constitution.
 - The Secretary of State's Office will notify the Governor that a sufficient number of signatures have been filed and that the initiative will be placed on the general election ballot in the manner provided by law.
 - The initiative will be assigned Proposition 205 in accordance with A.R.S. § 19-125.

Having completed the requirements of A.R.S. § 19-121.04, I hereby certify that:

639 signature pages bearing 7,274 signatures for initiative petition serial number I-08-2016 have been refused for filing in this office as provided by law. A total of that 1,158 signatures included on the remaining petition sheets were found to be ineligible. Of the total random sample of that 12,475 signatures, a total of 3,611 signatures were invalidated by the county recorders resulting in a failure rate of 28.95 percent. The actual number of remaining signatures for such initiative petition number I-08-2016 have are equal to or in excess of the minimum required by the constitution to place a measure on the general election ballot. The number of valid signatures filed with this petition, based on the random sample, appears to be at least one hundred percent of the minimum required or through examination of each signature has been certified to be greater than the minimum required by the constitution.
