Article 5 defines the application requirements for a basic life support (basic emergency medical technician) certification; application and physical prerequisites; the applicant screening process; application denial; certification examinations; duration of certification; out-of-state applicant processing; applicants with disabilities; the scope of practice; special skills certification; recertification requirements; recertification requirements for EMTs with special skills; extension of recertification; inactive status; reporting requirements; and enforcement actions.

Article 6 defines the application requirements for an advanced life support (intermediate EMT and paramedic) certification; application and physical prerequisites; the applicant screening process; application denial; certification examinations; duration of certification; out-of-state applicant processing; applicants with disabilities; the scope of practice; extended scope of practice training requirements; recertification requirements for paramedics and Intermediate EMTs; extension of recertification; inactive status; downgrading of certification; reporting requirements; and enforcement actions.
