

**EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF
GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS
ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)**

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER 98-9
ESTABLISHING A GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE
FOR MILITARY FACILITIES**

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona is a premier operational and training location for our military services; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has excellent weather, available uncongested airspace, access to world class training and research, development, test and evaluation ranges and communities that appreciate and respect our military services; and

WHEREAS, military operations and training in Arizona are extremely cost effective; and

WHEREAS, the operation of military facilities in Arizona contributes more than two billion dollars to our economy annually; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the State to ensure that all of our military facilities continue to operate in a manner that is effective for the military and compatible with the local communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, by the Arizona Constitution and the laws of the State, do hereby order a Task Force to serve the purpose of coordinating statewide efforts to ensure all military facilities in Arizona retain their premier status with respect to their national defense missions. This Task Force is to be known as the Governor's Military Facilities Task Force.

1. The Task Force shall initially be comprised of 28 members:
 - a. The Task Force membership will include the Governor, who will serve as chair of the Task Force. If the occasion shall so arise, the Governor may designate another member of her staff to chair meetings.
 - b. Examine business processes across multiple agencies, finding ways to connect them, using technology and other tools.
 - c. The Task Force will include the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - d. The Task Force will include the chairman of the county board of supervisors, or their

designees, of each county containing a major military facility, Cochise, Maricopa, Pima and Yuma.

- e. The Task Force will include four State Representatives, as designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - f. The Task Force will include four State Senators, as designated by the President of the Senate.
 - g. The Task Force will include eight non-elected community leaders selected by the Governor. Each area of the State with major military installation shall be represented by two of these non-elected leaders.
 - h. The Task Force will include The Adjutant General or his designee.
2. Member appointed by the Governor shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
 3. Members or designees shall not send alternates to represent them at Task Force meetings.
 4. The Task Force shall inform the Governor on matters affecting the operational viability of military within Arizona.
 - a. The Task Force will understand the mission of each military facility in this state.
 - b. The Task Force will examine the integral role of Arizona facilities within the national defense structure.
 - c. The Task Force will identify any obstacles to the mission of each of the facilities with regard to criteria used by their respective military service.
 - d. The Task Force will examine any state law, local ordinances, local zoning ordinances or requirements or any other state or local requirement, rule or regulation that impacts the mission of each of the military facilities in this state.
 - e. The Task Force will evaluate any locally developed proposals intended to mitigate the impact of military facilities on surrounding areas or the impact of non-military activities in surrounding areas

on the mission of military facilities.

- f. The Task Force will study the economic impacts of the facilities on the Arizona economy.
5. The Task Force shall make recommendations to the Governor relating to actions needed to ensure the viability of military facilities.
- a. The Task Force will recommend expenditures of state and local monies as appropriate to ensure the proper functioning and continued operation of military facilities within the state.
 - b. The Task Force will recommend any required changes to state law, local ordinances, local zoning requirements or any other state or local requirement, rule or regulation in order to encourage the continued operation of military facilities within the state.
 - c. The Task Force will recommend any required actions to be taken by the state at the federal level in support of military facilities within the state.
6. The Governor's Military Facilities Task Force shall be reviewed no later than June 30, 2003, to determine appropriate action for its continuance, modification or termination.

**IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED
EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

WHEREAS, beginning August 1, 1997, the Pinal County Board of Supervisors declared an emergency for health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Gila River Indian Community and Pinal County; and

WHEREAS, an intense fire has occurred in a tire storage area at the Black Water Industrial Park on the Gila River Reservation; and

WHEREAS, extensive smoke, intense winds, remoteness of the area, lack of facilities and intensity of the fire has created toxic fumes threatening the health, safety and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, citizens of the Black Water Indian Community have been evacuated; and

WHEREAS, both costs and resources required to combat the fire exceed the capability of the Gila River Indian Community and Pinal County;

WHEREAS, all recovery measures have now been completed and claims paid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Arizona, do hereby terminate the declaration of the state of emergency of August 4, 1997. All unexpected funds allocated to the emergency shall revert to the General Fund.

**IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED
EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

WHEREAS, precipitation throughout the State of Arizona during the past winter was the least ever recorded; and

WHEREAS, the lack of precipitation has significantly reduced surface and ground water supplies upon which citizens and commerce of the State are dependent upon; and

WHEREAS, the lack of water had created drought conditions throughout rural areas of the state with no near term relief; and

WHEREAS, the drought endangers the crops, property and livestock of a considerable number of the citizens of the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, these conditions were causing a severe hardship on effected political subdivisions of the State by exhausting their available resources to alleviate water shortage problems; and

WHEREAS, all recovery measures have now been completed and claims paid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Arizona, do hereby terminate the declaration of the state of emergency of June 7, 1996. All unexpected funds allocated to the emergency shall revert to the General Fund.

WHEREAS, on November 11 and 12, 1994, a severe storm bearing heavy rains caused extensive flood damage to roads and public structures in Greenlee County; and

**IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED
EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

WHEREAS, the lack of precipitation statewide has caused vegetation to be extremely dry and more susceptible to burning; and

WHEREAS, on March 5, 1996, the discovery of the karnal-bunt fungus in wheat crops constitutes an emergency to the welfare of the citizens of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, low humidity and unseasonably high temperatures have caused this fuel to be extremely dry and flammable adding to the serious fire hazard which created conditions of extreme peril to a considerable number of persons and to property throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, the karnal-bunt fungus represents an impact to the welfare of the citizens of wheat producing areas of southwestern and central Arizona not unlike epidemics of plague of disease or insects; and

WHEREAS, a severe forest and grassland contingency exists which, when in association with the rapid population increases and development in the rural/wildland areas of the State, could have endanger the lives and property of a considerable number of persons in the State or the State's political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, it was necessary to mitigate the outbreak and insure containment of contamination; and

WHEREAS, the State did not possess the capability for the immediate suppression of said fires; and

WHEREAS, the emergency conditions exceeded the capabilities of the affected political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, a statewide wildland fire emergency was declared on May 16, 1996, authorizing the State Forester to expend emergency funds for repositioning of resources to combat new starts of wildland fires pursuant to A.R.S. 37-623.02 and A.R.S. 35-192, or both, as amended; and

WHEREAS, all recovery measures have now been completed and claims paid;

WHEREAS, all recovery measures have now been completed and claims paid;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Arizona, do hereby terminate the declaration of the state of emergency of March 13, 1996. All unexpended funds allocated to the emergency shall revert to the General Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State, do hereby terminate the declaration of the state of emergency of May 16, 1996. All unexpended funds allocated to the emergency shall revert to the General Fund.
