

**EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF
GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS
ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)**

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed.

PROCLAMATION

by the

GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA

Calling a Sixth Special Session

of the Forty-fourth Legislature of the State of Arizona

By the power vested in me by Article IV, Part 2, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution, I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, call the 44th Legislature to meet in Sixth Special Session at the Capitol on Friday, the Twentieth day of October, 2000, at 9:30 a.m.

The subject to be considered at the special session shall be:

Effective immediately, suspending sections of Chapter 405, Laws 2000, to create a moratorium on tax credits and grants for alternative fuel vehicle refueling apparatus, infrastructure and delivery systems; moratorium on tax credits and grants for alternative fuels vehicles.

*** IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED EMERGENCY PROCEDURES***

WHEREAS, summer monsoon storms beginning July 2, 1999, through September 23, 1999, caused road closures and damage to property in Maricopa and Cochise Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Maricopa County and Cochise County Board of Supervisors each declared an emergency to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the general public of Maricopa and Cochise Counties; and

WHEREAS, damage to single family dwellings, businesses being closed, streets blocked off, shelters opened to accommodate displaced citizens and downed power poles created a life threatening situation; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature had authorized the expenditure of funds in accordance with established procedures contained in A.R.S. § 35-192, A.A.C. R8-2-301 to 321 and Executive Order 79-4;

NOW THEREFORE I, Jane Dee Hull, Governor of the State of Arizona, by the virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Arizona, do hereby terminate the declaration of the state of emergency of September 21, 1999. All unexpended funds allocated to the emergency shall revert to the General Fund.
