2. The subject matter of the proposed rule:

The proposed changes will update the rules affecting the use of radioactive material in the practice of medicine. Many of the changes are imposed on Arizona through an agreement with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). The changes being made offer new standards for medical users of radioactive material and are directly associated with the federal regulations located in 10 CFR 35. A thorough understanding of the new rules proposed for Article 7 can be obtained by reviewing NRC--NUREG-1556, Vol. 9, *Program-Specific Guidance About Medical Use Licenses*.

Not all of the new NRC standards are being incorporated into Arizona rule. Because the NRC recently amended the credentialing standards for authorized users, the agency was unable to include the new training standards in this rulemaking. Until these new standards can be added in a future rulemaking, the agency will continue to use the authorized user credentialing standards that have been enforced in Arizona for several years.
