Opinion Number	Date of opinion	Opinion summary
No. I06-001	March 27, 2006	Re: Certificates of Educational Convenience and Tuition Requirements If a student has a CEC issued pursuant to A.R.S. § 15-825(A) the school district of residence is not required to pay tuition to the school district within this State where the student actually attends school. Instead, the school district of attendance should include the student in its student count pursuant to A.R.S. § 15-825(A)(2). Because the student is included in the student count of the school district of attendance, the school district where the student resides should not include the student in its student count and should not receive state funding for the student.
