EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF

ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

WHEREAS, Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD) is a genetic disorder characterized by the growth of numerous fluid filled cysts on the kidneys reducing kidney function and leading to kidney failure; and

WHEREAS, Polycystic Kidney Disease is the fourth leading cause of kidney failure in the United States affecting approximately 600,000 people; and

WHEREAS, currently Polycystic Kidney Disease costs Americans more than \$2 billion each year in Medicaid and Medicare charges for dialysis and transplantation; and

WHEREAS, this disease does not discriminate, as it equally affects families, irrespective of age, race or ethnic origin; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Walk for PKD, established in an effort to promote awareness of this disease, is being held in our city of Tucson and Phoenix:

WHEREAS, the Save a Life Foundation's mission is training and developing people, starting with schoolchildren, to be active bystanders equipped with basic Life Supporting First Aid skills to aid during emergencies; and

WHEREAS, basic Life Supporting First Aid techniques, such as CPR, Heimlich maneuver, and the use of an Automatic External Defibrillators (AED) are essential in maintaining life prior to EMS arrival; and

WHEREAS, Save a Life Foundation, utilizes only Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Professionals as instructors to teach basic Life Supporting First Aid techniques to school children, grades K-12 and adults; and

WHEREAS, the United States Conference of Mayors passed the Community Response System Initiative (CRSI) Resolution and the United States Senate Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee passed the CRSI Act, both inspired by Save a Life Foundation, calling for communities to create CRSI's committees that would encourage citizens, especially children grades K-12, to learn supporting first aid skills allowing them to aid in emergencies; and

WHEREAS, Save a Life Foundation works with local, state and federal government organizations and the private sector to highlight the importance of public emergency preparedness and effective emergency response; and

WHEREAS, Save A Life Foundation, an affiliate of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Citizens Corps, encourages all municipalities to recognize Save A Life Month in conjunction with Homeland Security's National Preparedness Month, a nationwide effort to encourage Americans to prepare for emergencies; and
