**WHEREAS**, the AMBER Alert program was created in 1997 when Dallas/Fort Worth broadcasters teamed with local police to develop an early warning system as a legacy to 9 year-old Amber Hagerman, who was kidnapped while riding her bicycle and then murdered in Arlington, Texas; and

**WHEREAS**, in January, 2001 the Arizona Amber Alert Task Force Committee was formed through a partnership with Arizona Radio & Television broadcasters and law enforcement agencies to begin work on the Arizona Amber Alert plan; and

**WHEREAS**, in September, 2002, the Arizona AMBER Alert plan was activated statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, legislation was introduced to establish a nationwide communications-warning network in child abduction cases, and was signed into law by President George W. Bush on April 20, 2003; and

**WHEREAS**, the AMBER Alert program has been embraced by the citizenry of Arizona in a concentrated effort to protect
