EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF
GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS
ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

WHEREAS, on average, 700 people die each year in boating related accidents in the United States, nearly 70% of these are fatalities are caused by drowning; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of these accidents are caused by human error or poor judgment and not by the boat, equipment, or environmental factors; and

WHEREAS, a significant number of boaters who lose their lives by drowning each year would be alive today had they worn a life jacket; and

WHEREAS, modern life jackets are more comfortable, more attractive, and more wearable than styles of years past and deserve a fresh look by today's boating public.

WHEREAS, every child deserves to grow up in a safe and nurturing environment, free of the harmful effects of abuse and neglect; and

WHEREAS, last year Arizona Child Protective Services received over 33,000 reports involving the alleged mal-treatment of approximately 49,000 children; and

WHEREAS, the impact of child abuse and neglect extends far beyond its immediate, noticeable effects. The experience of abuse and neglect increases the likelihood of long-term physical and mental health problems, alcohol and substance abuse, continued family violence and criminal behavior; and

WHEREAS, the physical, psychological, and behavioral consequences of child abuse and neglect affect communities as a whole. Increased demand on physical and mental health care systems, law enforcement, judicial and public social services and community-based organizations; and

WHEREAS, the Strike Out Child Abuse Walk raises the awareness of child abuse prevention through the partnership of faith-based organizations such as Hope & A Future and community leaders such as Global Media and the Arizona Diamond-backs; and

WHEREAS, children are the greatest representation of our future. All citizens have a stake in building healthy families and communities for all of Arizona's children.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janice K. Brewer, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim April 24, 2010 as

and call upon the citizens of Arizona to participate in efforts to prevent child abuse, and renew their commitment to strengthening the communities in which we live.
