**EXECUTIVE ORDERS, PROCLAMATIONS OF
GENERAL APPLICABILITY, AND STATEMENTS
ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(3)**

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires the full-text publication of all Executive Orders and Proclamations of General Applicability issued by the Governor. In addition, the *Register* shall include each statement filed by the Governor in granting a commutation, pardon or reprieve, or stay or suspension of execution where a sentence of death is imposed. With the exception of egregious errors, content (including spelling, grammar, and punctuation) of these orders has been reproduced as submitted.

*** ALPHA-1 AWARENESS MONTH ***

WHEREAS, Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency (AAT Deficiency or Alpha-1) is one of the most common serious hereditary disorders in the world and can result in life-threatening liver disease in children and adults or in lung disease in adults; and

WHEREAS, Alpha-1 has been identified in virtually all populations. An estimated 25 million people in the U.S. carry a single deficient gene that causes Alpha-1 and may pass the gene on to their children; and

WHEREAS, Alpha-1 is widely under-diagnosed and misdiagnosed. Less than 10% of those predicted to have Alpha-1 have been diagnosed and it often takes an average of five doctors and seven years from the time symptoms first appear before proper diagnosis is made, which can be detected by a simple blood test; and

WHEREAS, it is important to increase awareness and detection of this serious hereditary and misdiagnosed disorder; and

WHEREAS, during the month of November, an awareness campaign will take place throughout the state to include educating the public as well as our medical community on Alpha-1 and detection and treatment for those affected by this condition; and

WHEREAS, a nationwide awareness campaign by the entire Alpha-1 Community will take place throughout the United States during the month of November.

WHEREAS, Civil Air Patrol (CAP) was established on December 1, 1941, to supplement the U.S. military during World War II; and

WHEREAS, in 1948 CAP was designated as the U.S. Air Force's official auxiliary with three missions – emergency services, cadet programs, and aerospace education; and

WHEREAS, since CAP's beginning, the organization has set itself apart during the country's most tumultuous times; locating and sinking enemy submarines during World War II, assisting rescuers and state agencies immediately following the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, heavily supporting hurricane relief efforts during the 2005 hurricane season, and more recently in response to Hurricane Ike's devastation in 2008, as well as aiding communities during other natural disasters such as floods, wildfires, ice storms, and tornadoes; and

WHEREAS, CAP further provides vital homeland security missions that help ensure the protection of the nation's capital and the nation as a whole by assisting Air Force pilots with target-intercept training; and
