

NOTICES OF SUBSTANTIVE POLICY STATEMENTS

The Administrative Procedure Act requires the publication of substantive policy statements issued by agencies (A.R.S. § 41-1013(B)(14)). Substantive policy statements are written expressions which inform the general public of an agency's current approach to rule or regulation practice. Substantive policy statements are advisory only. A substantive policy statement does not include internal procedural documents that only affect the internal procedures of the agency and does not impose additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties or include confidential information or rules made in accordance with the Arizona Administrative Procedure Act. If you believe that a substantive policy statement does impose additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties you may petition the agency under A.R.S. § 41-1033 for a review of the statement.

Definition of a Day and Year as Used in A.R.S. § 32-2075(A)(4) (SP 02-12)

3. Summary of the contents of the substantive policy statement:

This statement clarifies the Board's interpretation of A.R.S. § 32-2075(A)(4), which applies to psychologists not licensed in Arizona, but licensed in another jurisdiction and practice for a short period of time in Arizona.

4. Federal or state constitutional provision; federal or state statute, administrative rule, or regulation or final court judgment that underlies the substantive policy statement

A.R.S. § 32-2075(A)(4):

A person who resides outside of this state and who is currently licensed or certified to practice psychology at the independent level by a licensing jurisdiction of the United States or Canada if the activities and services conducted in this state are within the psychologist's customary area of practice, do not exceed 20 days per year and are not otherwise in violation of this chapter and the client, public or consumer is informed of the limited nature of these activities and services and that the psychologist is not licensed in this state. A person may exceed the 20 day limitation requirement of this paragraph to assist in public service that is related to a disaster as acknowledged by the board.
