CHAPTER 247

HOUSE BILL 2277

AN ACT

AMENDING LAWS 1994, NINTH SPECIAL SESSION, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 10, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 1995, CHAPTER 272, SECTION 2; MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS; RELATING TO COMMUNITY AND FAMILY PROGRAMS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Laws 1994, ninth special session, chapter 1, section 10,
3 as amended by Laws 1995, chapter 272, section 2, is amended to read:

4 Sec. 10. Joint committee on community program evaluation;
5 membership; duties; report

6 A. The joint committee on community program evaluation is established
7 consisting of the following members:

8 1. The chairman of the house of representatives health committee.

9 2. A member of the house of representatives health committee who is
10 not of the same political party as the committee chairman and who is
11 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

12 3. The chairman of the senate health committee.

13 4. Two members of the senate health committee, one of whom is not of
14 the same political party as the committee chairman, who are appointed by the
15 president of the senate.

16 5. The chairman of the house of representatives human services
17 committee.

18 6. The chairman of the house of representatives appropriations
19 committee.

20 7. A member of the house of representatives appropriations committee
21 who is not a member of the same political party as the committee chairman and
22 who is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

1 8. The chairman of the senate appropriations committee.

2 9. A member of the senate appropriations committee who is not a member
3 of the same political party as the committee chairman and who is appointed
4 by the president of the senate.

5 10. The chairman of the house of representatives appropriations
6 subcommittee on health and welfare/transportation.

7 11. The chairman of the senate appropriations subcommittee on health
8 and welfare/transportation.

9 B. The chairman of the house health committee shall act as chairman
10 of the committee in even numbered years. The chairman of the senate health
11 committee shall act as chairman of the committee in odd numbered years. The
12 committee shall meet at the call of the chairman, with the approval of the
13 speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate.

14 C. The committee shall:

15 1. Oversee the implementation of the pilot programs established in
16 this act.

17 ~~D. 2. The committee shall~~ Review and make recommendations concerning
18 all proposals for additions or modifications to the pilot programs in
19 sections 36-697 and 8-701 and title 15, chapter 1, article 8, Arizona Revised
20 Statutes, as added by this act. The committee shall also monitor the
21 implementation of these additions or modifications.

22 ~~E. 3. The committee shall~~ Track and monitor the auditor general's
23 annual programmatic evaluations and recommendations.

24 4. RECOMMEND CRITERIA FOR:

25 (a) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES TO USE IN DETERMINING WHICH
26 CONTRACTORS THE DEPARTMENT WILL HIRE TO PROVIDE SERVICES FOR THE HEALTH START
27 PILOT PROGRAM.

28 (b) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES TO DEVELOP A SCREENING METHOD
29 TO DETERMINE THE WOMEN WHO ARE MOST IN NEED OF SERVICES THROUGH THE HEALTH
30 START PILOT PROGRAM

31 (c) THE TYPE OF SERVICES DELIVERED ACCORDING TO THE NEEDS OF THE
32 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IN THE HEALTH START PILOT PROGRAM.

33 D. THE COMMITTEE SHALL PREPARE A REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE
34 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA IN SUBSECTION C, PARAGRAPH 4 OF THIS SECTION AND SUBMIT
35 THE REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
36 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES
37 BY OCTOBER 1, 1996.

38 Sec. 2., Department of health services; health start program
39 coordination study; report

40 A. The department of health services shall conduct a study to assess
41 the feasibility of comprehensive program coordination for the health start
42 pilot program including:

1 1. A list of all of the prenatal and early childhood health programs
2 that are available in this state at the federal, state, county and municipal
3 levels.

4 2. An assessment of the goals, types of intervention and costs of the
5 available programs.

6 3. An assessment of the needs of target populations and communities
7 and to what extent current community resources are meeting the needs.

8 4. An analysis of various consolidation strategies within and among
9 current programs and administration of programs and block grant strategies
10 to improve comprehensive program services.

11 5. A plan for coordinating all of the available services to minimize
12 the duplication of the provision of services to program service recipients.

13 B. The department of health services shall submit a report with
14 recommendations on the study by October 1, 1996 to the joint committee on
15 community program evaluation established by Laws 1994, ninth special session,
16 chapter 1, section 10, as amended by Laws 1995, chapter 272, section 2.

17 Sec. 3. Appropriations; purpose

18 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the state general fund
19 to the department of economic security to implement the healthy families
20 pilot program established by section 8-701, Arizona Revised Statutes:

21 1. In fiscal year 1996-1997, the sum of \$3,000,000.

22 2. In fiscal year 1997-1998, the sum of \$3,000,000.

23 B. The following amounts are appropriated from the state general fund
24 to the state board of education to implement the family literacy pilot
25 program established by title 15, chapter 1, article 8, Arizona Revised
26 Statutes:

27 1. In fiscal year 1996-1997, the sum of \$1,000,000.

28 2. In fiscal year 1997-1998, the sum of \$1,000,000.

29 C. The following amounts are appropriated from the state general fund
30 to the department of health services to implement the health start pilot
31 program established by sections 36-697 and 36-698, Arizona Revised Statutes:

32 1. In fiscal year 1996-1997, the sum of \$1,400,000.

33 2. In fiscal year 1997-1998, the sum of \$1,400,000.

34 Sec. 4. Exemption; reversion

35 The appropriations made in section 3 of this act are exempt from the
36 provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing
37 of appropriations, except that all monies remaining unexpended and
38 unencumbered on July 1, 1998 revert to the state general fund.

39 Sec. 5. Delayed repeals

40 A. ~~Laws 1994, ninth special session, chapter 1, section 10, as amended~~
41 ~~by Laws 1995, chapter 272, section 2 and section 1 of this act is repealed~~
42 ~~from and after June 30, 1998.~~

43 B. Section 2 of this act is repealed from and after June 30, 1998.
