CHAPTER 44
HOUSE BILL 2545

AN ACT

CREATING THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED PLUMBING CODE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Committee on statewide standardized plumbing code

3 A. The committee on the statewide standardized plumbing code is
4 established consisting of eleven members appointed as follows:

5 1. Four representatives of the plumbing trades. Two members shall be
6 appointed by the president of the senate, one member shall be appointed by
7 the speaker of the house of representatives and one member shall be appointed
8 by the governor.

9 2. Four representatives of city or town governments or unincorporated
10 areas. One person shall represent cities or towns with a population of four
11 hundred thousand persons or more and one person shall represent
12 unincorporated areas and shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of
13 representatives. One person shall represent cities or towns with a
14 population of less than four hundred thousand persons and more than one
15 hundred thousand persons and shall be appointed by the president of the
16 senate. One person shall represent cities or towns with a population of one
17 hundred thousand persons or less and shall be appointed by the governor.

18 3. Three members of the general public who have no occupational or
19 professional connection to city or town governments or the plumbing trades.
20 The governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president
21 of the senate shall each appoint one person.

22 B. Members of the committee are not eligible for compensation or
23 reimbursement of expenses. The registrar of contractors shall provide space
24 appropriate for the committee to hold its meetings.

1 C. The committee on the statewide standardized plumbing code shall
2 meet at least four times each year, and at their first meeting, shall elect
3 a member to chair the committee.

4 D. The committee on the statewide standardized plumbing code shall
5 make recommendations to the legislature by November 15, 1996 regarding the
6 adoption of a statewide standardized plumbing code. The committee shall
7 draft a proposed code or adopt an existing standardized code. Any code
8 proposed or recommended by the committee shall include provisions for the
9 following:

10 1. A process for the exemption of specific cities and towns from any
11 specific portion of the code for reasons of health or public safety in a
12 specific geographic location.

13 2. A process for the committee to make periodic recommendations to the
14 legislature regarding appropriate changes in the statewide standardized
15 plumbing code.

16 Sec. 2. Repeal

17 Section 1 of this act is repealed on February 1, 1997.
