CHAPTER 73

HOUSE BILL 2307

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 41-541, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE ARIZONA COMMISSION OF INDIAN AFFAIRS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 41-541, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 41-541. Commission of Indian affairs; members; term;
5 compensation; officers; meetings; duties

6 A. The Arizona commission of Indian affairs shall consist of the
7 governor, the superintendent of public instruction, the director of the
8 department of health services, the director of the department of
9 transportation, the attorney general, the director of the department of
10 economic security, the director of the office of tourism and the director of
11 the department of commerce, or their representatives, who shall be ex officio
12 members, and nine members appointed by the governor, two at large who shall
13 be non-Indian, and seven from among the Indian tribes. Each tribe or tribal
14 council may submit the names of not to exceed two members of its tribe, and
15 from the names so submitted, the governor shall appoint the seven Indian
16 members.

17 B. The term of office of each appointive member shall be three years.
18 The terms of three appointive members shall expire on the first Monday in
19 January each year. Each member shall hold office until his THE MEMBER'S
20 successor is appointed and qualifies. Appointment to fill a vacancy caused
21 otherwise than by expiration of a term shall be for the unexpired portion of
22 the term.

23 C. Members of the commission serving by virtue of their office shall
24 serve without compensation. Appointed members are eligible to receive
25 compensation as determined pursuant to section 38-611 for each day of
26 attendance at meetings.

27 D. The commission shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman, who
28 shall be appointive members, and adopt rules ~~and regulations~~ for the conduct
29 of meetings. A record shall be kept of all proceedings and transactions.

30 E. The commission shall meet at least quarterly on the second Thursday
31 of the first month of each quarter and may hold additional meetings upon the
32 call of the chairman. A majority of the appointed members of the commission
33 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but ex officio
34 members may vote. Members who fail to attend three consecutive meetings
35 shall be deemed to have resigned.

36 F. The commission may apply for, accept, receive and expend public and
37 private gifts or grants of money or property upon such terms and conditions
38 as may be imposed by the donor and for implementation of the commission's
39 internal operations.

40 G. THE COMMISSION MAY ACCEPT, RECEIVE AND SPEND FEES COLLECTED AT THE
41 ARIZONA INDIAN TOWN HALL TO DEFER EXPENSES FOR THE ARIZONA INDIAN TOWN HALL
42 THAT EXCEED THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED BY THE LEGISLATURE FOR THE ARIZONA INDIAN
43 TOWN HALL.
