AN ACT

ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR ACCEPTANCE OF
NOMINATION PAPERS AND PETITIONS FROM 2002 LEGISLATIVE CANDIDATES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. 2002 legislative candidates; secretary of state;
3 nomination papers and petitions; nomination
4 signatures

5 Notwithstanding any other law, for candidates for election in 2002 to
6 the legislature, the following apply:

7 1. If the nomination paper and nomination petition are in compliance
8 with otherwise applicable law, the secretary of state shall accept as a valid
9 filing the nomination paper and nomination petition of a person that
10 designates a legislative district for that person's candidacy and that uses
11 any or all of the following:

12 (a) A legislative district number as used in the 2000 elections.

13 (b) A legislative district as denominated in a redistricting plan
14 adopted by the independent redistricting commission.

15 (c) A legislative district as denominated in a redistricting plan that
16 is precleared by the United States department of justice.

17 2. If the candidate nomination petition and the petition signers are
18 in compliance with otherwise applicable law, the secretary of state shall
19 accept and petition signers are valid if the petition signers are registered
20 voters who are residents of any or all of the following districts that the
21 candidate proposes to represent:

22 (a) A legislative district as used in the 2000 elections.

23 (b) A legislative district as denominated in a redistricting plan
24 adopted by the independent redistricting commission.

25 (c) A legislative district as denominated in a redistricting plan that
26 is precleared by the United States department of justice.

27 Sec. 2. Emergency

28 This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the
29 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by
30 law.
