# SENATE BILL 1237

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 32-1301, 32-1382, 32-1390.01, 32-1390.02 AND 32-1399,  
ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO FUNERAL DIRECTORS AND ESTABLISHMENTS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 32-1301, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 32-1301. Definitions

5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Accredited" means recognized or authorized by the American board  
7 of funeral service education.

8 2. "Administrative costs and expenses" means the cost of copies,  
9 transcripts, court reporter and witness fees, reimbursement for mileage and  
10 office of administrative hearing HEARINGS costs.

11 3. "Alternative container" means any unfinished wood box or other  
12 nonmetal receptacle or enclosure, without ornamentation or a fixed interior  
13 lining, that is designed for the encasement of human remains.

14 4. "Apprentice embalmer" means a person who is registered pursuant to  
15 this chapter and who is engaged in embalming under the supervision of a  
16 licensed embalmer.

17 5. "Authorizing agent" means a person who is legally entitled to order  
18 the cremation, disinterment or embalming of human remains PURSUANT TO SECTION  
19 32-1365.02.

20 6. "Beneficiary" means a person whose future funeral arrangements will  
21 be handled by a funeral establishment pursuant to a prearranged funeral  
22 agreement.

23 7. "Board" means the state board of funeral directors and embalmers.

24 8. "Business entity" includes any corporation, association, limited  
25 liability company, professional corporation, partnership, limited  
26 partnership, sole proprietorship, business trust, trust, joint venture and  
27 other business entity.

28 9. "Casket" means a rigid container that is designed for the permanent  
29 encasement of human remains and that is usually constructed of wood, metal  
30 or man-made SYNTHETIC substances and ornamented and lined with fabric.

31 10. "Change of ownership" means a transfer of a controlling legal or  
32 equitable interest in a licensed funeral establishment or crematory resulting  
33 from a sale or merger. If the establishment or crematory is operated by a  
34 business entity, any transfer of the ownership of ten per cent or more of the  
35 entity constitutes a change of ownership.

36 11. "Conviction" means a criminal adjudication OR CONVICTION by any  
37 state or federal court of competent jurisdiction, including a judgment based  
38 on a no contest plea, without regard to whether civil rights have been  
39 restored.

40 12. "Cremated remains" means the remaining bone fragments after  
41 cremation.

42 13. "Cremation" means the heating process that reduces human remains  
43 to bone fragments by combustion and evaporation.

- 1       14. "Cremation container" means a leak and spill resistant, rigid,  
2 combustible, closed receptacle into which human remains are placed before  
3 cremation.
- 4       15. "Cremationist" means a person who is engaged in cremation.
- 5       16. "Crematory" means a building or portion of a building that is  
6 licensed pursuant to article 6 of this chapter AND that houses a retort in  
7 which only human remains are cremated.
- 8       17. "Disciplinary action" means action taken by the board to revoke or  
9 suspend a license or registration, to impose probationary requirements or  
10 civil penalties or to issue a letter of censure or reprimand to any person  
11 who is subject to this chapter and who violates any provision of this chapter  
12 or rules adopted by the board.
- 13       18. "Embalmer" means a person who is licensed pursuant to this chapter  
14 and who is engaged in embalming.
- 15       19. "Embalmer's assistant" means a person who is registered pursuant  
16 to this chapter and who is engaged in embalming without the supervision of  
17 a licensed embalmer.
- 18       20. "Embalming" means the implementation of reconstructive procedures  
19 or the process of disinfecting and preserving a dead human body to retard  
20 organic decomposition by treating the body to reduce the presence and growth  
21 of organisms.
- 22       21. "Financial institution" means a bank, savings and loan association,  
23 trust company or credit union that is lawfully doing business in this state  
24 and that is not affiliated with a funeral establishment.
- 25       22. "Fixed price prearranged funeral agreement funded by trust" means  
26 any agreement or combination of agreements that establishes a fixed price for  
27 funeral goods and services, that requires a funeral establishment to provide  
28 those funeral goods and services at the price levels in effect at the time  
29 of the execution of the agreement and that requires the purchaser to convey  
30 all or a portion of the accrued interest to the funeral establishment at the  
31 time that the funeral goods and services are actually provided.
- 32       23. "Funded by insurance" means that monies for a prearranged funeral  
33 agreement are paid directly to an insurance company licensed pursuant to  
34 title 20 on behalf of the beneficiary of the agreement.
- 35       24. "Funeral directing" means arranging, directing or providing a  
36 service in the disposition of dead human bodies for compensation.
- 37       25. "Funeral director" means a person who is licensed pursuant to this  
38 chapter and who is engaged in funeral directing.
- 39       26. "Funeral establishment" means a business at a specific location  
40 that is licensed pursuant to this chapter and that is devoted to the care,  
41 storage or preparation for final disposition or transportation of dead human  
42 bodies.
- 43       27. "Funeral goods and services" means any personal property or  
44 services typically sold or provided in connection with the final disposition  
45 of human remains, including caskets, alternative containers, outer burial

1 containers, cremation containers, transportation containers, funeral clothing  
2 or accessories, monuments, grave markers, urns, embalming services, funeral  
3 directing services and similar funeral or burial items. Funeral goods and  
4 services does not include goods and services sold by cemeteries.

5 28. "Good moral character" means that a person:

6 (a) Has not been convicted of a class 1 or 2 felony by a court of  
7 competent jurisdiction.

8 (b) Has not, within five years of application for licensure or  
9 registration, been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor if the offense has  
10 a reasonable relationship to the person's proposed area of licensure or  
11 registration.

12 (c) Has not, within five years of application for licensure or  
13 registration, committed any act involving dishonesty, fraud,  
14 misrepresentation, breach of fiduciary duty, gross negligence or incompetence  
15 if the act has a reasonable relationship to the person's proposed area of  
16 licensure or registration.

17 (d) Is not currently incarcerated in or on community supervision after  
18 a period of imprisonment in a local, state or federal penal institution or  
19 on criminal probation.

20 (e) Has not engaged in fraud or misrepresentation in connection with  
21 an application for licensure or registration under this chapter or an  
22 examination required for licensure or registration.

23 (f) Has not, within five years of application for licensure or  
24 registration, had a license, registration or endorsement revoked or suspended  
25 by the board or by the funeral services licensing authority of any other  
26 jurisdiction.

27 (g) Has not surrendered a license, registration or endorsement to the  
28 board or the funeral licensing authority of any other jurisdiction in lieu  
29 of disciplinary action.

30 (h) Has not practiced funeral directing or embalming without a license  
31 in this state or any other jurisdiction that requires licensure to perform  
32 these activities.

33 29. "Holding facility" means a designated area for the retention of  
34 human remains.

35 30. "Human remains" means a dead human body.

36 31. "Intern" means a person who is licensed pursuant to this chapter  
37 and who is engaged in embalming under the supervision of a licensed embalmer.

38 32. "License" means a written authorization that is issued by the board  
39 and that entitles a person to act as a funeral director, embalmer or intern  
40 or to operate a funeral establishment or crematory in this state.

41 33. "Licensee" means a person to whom the board has issued a license  
42 to act as a funeral director, embalmer or intern or to operate a funeral  
43 establishment or crematory in this state.

1 34. "Manage" means:

2 (a) For a responsible funeral director to exercise control and  
3 oversight over all employees of a funeral establishment and over funeral  
4 transactions, including the care of dead human bodies, funeral services and  
5 activities and the documentation and retention of records.

6 (b) For a responsible cremationist to exercise control and oversight  
7 over all employees of a crematory and crematory operations.

8 35. "National board examination" means the test or tests given by the  
9 conference of funeral service examining boards to determine the entry level  
10 knowledge and skills of a person regarding funeral directing and embalming.

11 36. "Net interest" means interest earned on a prearranged funeral trust  
12 account less applicable taxes, reasonable and necessary charges made by the  
13 financial institution and the annual service fee permitted to be deducted by  
14 the funeral establishment according to section 32-1391.06, subsection B.

15 37. "Outer burial container" means a container that is designed for  
16 placement in a grave around a casket, including burial vaults, grave boxes  
17 and grave liners.

18 38. "Owner" means a person who owns ten per cent or more of a business  
19 entity. Owner does not include shareholders of companies who have a class  
20 of common equity stock listed or authorized to be listed on the New York  
21 stock exchange, OR the American stock exchange, or listed on the NASDAQ  
22 stock market.

23 39. "Person legally responsible" means the person responsible for  
24 burying a dead body as determined in section 36-831.

25 40. "Prearranged funeral agreement" means any agreement or combination  
26 of agreements under which a payment is made before the death of the intended  
27 beneficiary for funeral goods and services to be delivered or performed after  
28 the death of the beneficiary.

29 41. "Prearranged funeral trust account" means a trust account that is  
30 established at a financial institution and into which all monies paid on  
31 behalf of a beneficiary pursuant to a prearranged funeral agreement are  
32 deposited.

33 42. "Preparation" means washing, shaving, dressing or arranging hair  
34 on, applying cosmetics to or positioning bodily features on a dead human body  
35 and placing a dead human body in a casket.

36 43. "Processed cremated remains" means cremated remains after they are  
37 pulverized and cleaned, leaving primarily small bone fragments.

38 44. "Provisionally accredited" means granted candidacy status by the  
39 American board of funeral service education.

40 45. "Registration" means a written authorization that is issued by the  
41 board and that entitles a person to act as an apprentice embalmer, an  
42 assistant funeral director, an embalmer's assistant or a prearranged funeral  
43 salesperson in this state.

44 46. "Responsible cremationist" means a person who manages a crematory.

1 47. "Responsible funeral director" means a person who is licensed  
2 pursuant to this chapter, who is engaged in funeral directing and who manages  
3 AND IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR a funeral establishment.

4 48. "Retort" means an enclosed space within which cremation takes  
5 place.

6 49. "State equivalent examination" means the test or tests provided by  
7 the conference of funeral service examining boards and offered by the board  
8 to determine the entry level knowledge and skills of a person regarding  
9 funeral directing and embalming.

10 50. "Supervise" or "supervision" means a licensed embalmer has  
11 responsibility for and is within sight and sound of a registered apprentice  
12 embalmer or licensed intern who is embalming a dead human body or a student  
13 who is assisting in embalming a dead human body.

14 51. "Temporary container" means a receptacle that is usually made of  
15 cardboard, rigid plastic or another similar material and that is designed to  
16 hold processed cremated remains until they are placed in an urn or another  
17 permanent container.

18 52. "Trust funds" means all monies deposited on behalf of a beneficiary  
19 of a prearranged funeral agreement funded by trust and all accrued net  
20 interest. Trust funds shall be considered an account kept in suspense until  
21 distributed to the beneficiary, the funeral establishment or the estate of  
22 the beneficiary in accordance with this article.

23 53. "Universal precautions" means the universal blood and fluid  
24 precautions recommended by the centers for disease control of the United  
25 States public health service to prevent the transmission of blood-borne and  
26 bodily fluid-borne infectious diseases.

27 54. "Unprofessional conduct" includes the following acts, whether  
28 occurring in this state or elsewhere:

29 (a) Commission of a class 1 or 2 felony.

30 (b) Commission of a felony or misdemeanor if the offense has a  
31 reasonable relationship to funeral directing or embalming. Conviction by any  
32 court of competent jurisdiction or a plea of no contest is conclusive  
33 evidence of the commission.

34 (c) Providing false, misleading or deceptive information on an  
35 application for licensure or registration pursuant to this chapter or on an  
36 examination required for licensure or registration.

37 (d) Bribing or offering to bribe, directly or indirectly, a member of  
38 the board to influence the member's actions in the performance of the  
39 member's duties.

40 (e) Wilfully interfering with an embalmer or funeral director who has  
41 lawful custody of a dead human body in the performance of the embalmer's or  
42 funeral director's duty to embalm or prepare the body for burial or  
43 transportation.

1 (f) Paying or causing money or other valuable consideration to be paid  
2 to a person, other than an employee of a funeral establishment, to secure  
3 business regulated pursuant to this chapter from or through the person.

4 (g) Violating any law of this state or any rule adopted by the  
5 department of health services that relates to the embalming or preparation  
6 of dead human bodies.

7 (h) Certifying falsely to having embalmed or prepared a dead human  
8 body that was embalmed by a person other than a licensed embalmer making the  
9 certification or an intern or apprentice embalmer under the supervision of  
10 a licensed embalmer making the certification.

11 (i) Falsely advertising or labeling any service or merchandise with  
12 the intention of deceiving the public.

13 (j) Shipping or delivering any merchandise or supplies that are not  
14 the substantial equivalent of or superior in quality to merchandise or  
15 supplies previously presented to the purchaser as samples.

16 (k) Committing any act involving dishonesty, fraud, misrepresentation,  
17 breach of fiduciary duty, gross negligence or incompetence if the act has a  
18 reasonable relationship to funeral directing or embalming.

19 (l) Engaging in any conduct or practice that is reasonably related to  
20 funeral directing or embalming and that is or may be harmful or dangerous to  
21 the health, safety or welfare of the public.

22 (m) Within a period of five years, having a license, registration or  
23 endorsement suspended or revoked by the board or by the funeral services  
24 licensing authority of any other jurisdiction or surrendering a license,  
25 registration or endorsement in lieu of disciplinary action.

26 55. "Urn" means a receptacle into which processed cremated remains are  
27 placed for disposition.

28 Sec. 2. Section 32-1382, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
29 32-1382. Funeral establishment requirements; responsible  
30 funeral director

31 A. A funeral establishment licensed pursuant to this article shall:

32 1. Provide separate rooms for each of the following:

33 (a) An area inside the establishment that may be used as a chapel for  
34 conducting funeral services.

35 (b) A preparation room meeting minimum requirements adopted by the  
36 board that is maintained at all times in a sanitary and professional manner,  
37 with sanitary flooring, drainage and ventilation and that is equipped with  
38 instruments and supplies necessary for the protection of the health and  
39 safety of the public and employees of the establishment in connection with  
40 the preparation and embalming of dead human bodies. Nothing prohibits the  
41 embalming of a body at a central location.

42 (c) A display area for displaying funeral goods or the display of  
43 funeral goods by photograph or electronic means.

1           2. Provide access to hearses or funeral coaches that are properly  
2 equipped for the transportation of dead human bodies and that are kept in a  
3 sanitary and professional manner.

4           3. Employ and designate a responsible funeral director to manage AND  
5 SUPERVISE the daily operation of the funeral establishment. The responsible  
6 funeral director is responsible for the funeral establishment complying with  
7 the laws of this state and the rules of the board. The establishment or the  
8 responsible funeral director shall designate a licensed funeral director to  
9 act as an interim responsible funeral director.

10          B. All employees of a funeral establishment who handle dead human  
11 bodies shall use universal precautions and shall exercise reasonable care to  
12 minimize the risk of transmitting any communicable disease from a dead human  
13 body.

14          Sec. 3. Section 32-1390.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
15 read:

16          32-1390.01. Funeral establishments; disciplinary action; civil  
17 penalty

18          A. The board may deny or refuse to renew the license of a funeral  
19 establishment or may take disciplinary action against a funeral establishment  
20 for any of the following reasons:

- 21           1. Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a license.
- 22           2. Failure to employ and designate a responsible funeral director.
- 23           3. The display or use of a funeral establishment license at any place  
24 other than the establishment to which it is issued.
- 25           4. A violation of any provision of title 44, chapter 10, article 7.
- 26           5. A violation of any provision of this chapter or a rule adopted  
27 pursuant to this chapter.
- 28           6. An act by an agent or an employee of a funeral establishment that  
29 violates any provision of this chapter or rules adopted pursuant to this  
30 chapter.

31          B. THE ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF AN AGENT OR EMPLOYEE OF A FUNERAL  
32 ESTABLISHMENT THAT VIOLATE ANY PROVISION OF THIS CHAPTER OR RULES ADOPTED  
33 PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER ARE CONSIDERED TO BE THE ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THE  
34 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT.

35          ~~B.~~ C. If the board finds that a funeral establishment has committed  
36 an offense listed in subsection A, it may TAKE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- 37           1. ISSUE A LETTER OF CENSURE OR REPRIMAND.
- 38           2. IMPOSE PROBATIONARY TERMS AS THE BOARD CONSIDERS NECESSARY TO  
39 PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE AND TO REHABILITATE OR EDUCATE  
40 THE LICENSEE, INCLUDING RESTITUTION TO ANY CUSTOMER OR OTHER PERSON WHO WAS  
41 INJURED BY A VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER OR RULE ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS  
42 CHAPTER.
- 43           3. IMPOSE A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS PER  
44 VIOLATION.

1 4. Revoke the license of the establishment pursuant to a disciplinary  
2 proceeding.

3 ~~5. If the board suspends a funeral establishment license after finding~~  
4 ~~that the establishment committed an offense listed in subsection A, the board~~  
5 ~~shall not~~ Suspend the license for NOT more than ninety days for a first  
6 offense or NOT more than one hundred eighty days for a second offense.

7 Sec. 4. Section 32-1390.02, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
8 read:

9 32-1390.02. Funeral establishments; disciplinary proceedings;  
10 notice

11 A. Article 3 of this chapter and rules adopted pursuant to article 3  
12 of this chapter govern disciplinary proceedings brought against a funeral  
13 establishment.

14 B. ANY NOTICE REQUIRED TO BE SERVED BY THE BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION  
15 32-1367, SUBSECTION K ON A PERSON LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 2 OF THIS  
16 CHAPTER SHALL ALSO BE SERVED BY THE BOARD ON EACH FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT THAT  
17 EMPLOYED OR HIRED THE PERSON AT THE TIME OF THE CONDUCT CAUSING THE BOARD TO  
18 SERVE THE NOTICE ON THE PERSON. EACH FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT SHALL IDENTIFY  
19 THE PERSON TO WHOM THE BOARD SHALL SEND THE NOTICE TO BE SERVED ON THE  
20 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT AS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION.

21 Sec. 5. Section 32-1399, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22 32-1399. Crematories; standards of practice

23 The board shall adopt rules that establish standards equivalent to  
24 section 32-1307, subsection A, paragraph 5 for the regulation of crematories  
25 and cremation and that include the following:

26 1. A crematory shall develop, implement and maintain a written  
27 procedure for the identification of human remains that ensures that remains  
28 can be identified from the time that a crematory accepts the delivery of the  
29 remains until the cremated remains are released to the authorizing  
30 agent. THE IDENTIFICATION PROCEDURE SHALL REQUIRE THE CREMATORY TO COMPLY  
31 WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. THE CREMATORY SHALL NOT OPEN A  
32 CONTAINER CONTAINING HUMAN REMAINS, EXCEPT UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A  
33 LICENSED FUNERAL DIRECTOR OR EMBALMER. After taking custody of human  
34 remains, a crematory shall immediately verify the identification attached to  
35 the casket or cremation container and ASSIGN AN IDENTIFICATION NUMBER. THE  
36 CREMATORY shall not accept unidentified caskets or cremation containers. The  
37 identification shall include the name and address of the deceased, the name  
38 and relationship of the authorizing agent, the name of the person or entity  
39 engaging the crematory services, and a valid cremation permit issued by a  
40 government agency AND A METAL CREMATION DISK CONTAINING THE IDENTIFICATION  
41 NUMBER. THE DISK SHALL BE PLACED WITH THE DECEASED DURING CREMATION.

42 2. If a crematory is unable to cremate the human remains immediately  
43 after taking custody, the crematory shall store the remains in a holding  
44 facility that is secure from access by anyone other than employees of the  
45 crematory and public officials in the performance of their duty and that

1 complies with applicable public health laws, preserves the dignity of the  
2 human remains and protects the health of employees of the crematory.

3 3. A crematory shall not accept a casket or cremation container from  
4 which there is evidence of leakage of body fluids from the human remains and  
5 shall not hold human remains for cremation unless they are contained in an  
6 individual, closed casket or rigid cremation container of combustible  
7 material that preserves the dignity of the human remains and that protects  
8 the health of employees of the crematory. Human remains that are not  
9 embalmed shall be held by the crematory in a refrigerated holding facility  
10 or in compliance with applicable public health laws.

11 4. All body prostheses, bridgework or similar items removed from the  
12 cremated remains shall be disposed of by the crematory unless an alternative  
13 disposition is agreed to in the authorization to cremate.

14 5. After cremation, the crematory as far as practicable shall remove  
15 visible parts of the residual of the cremation process from the retort, shall  
16 not combine the cremated or processed remains with other cremated or  
17 processed remains and shall attach the identification of the cremated or  
18 processed remains to the temporary container or urn into which the remains  
19 are placed.

20 6. The crematory shall place cremated or processed remains in a  
21 temporary container or urn. Extra space may be filled with clean packing  
22 material that will not combine with the cremated or processed remains. The  
23 lid or top shall be securely closed. Any cremated or processed remains that  
24 do not fit in the temporary container or urn shall be returned in a separate  
25 container or, with permission of the authorizing agent, disposed of by the  
26 crematory.

27 7. A crematory may dispose of cremated or processed remains in any  
28 legal manner directed by a document prepared pursuant to section 32-1365.01  
29 or agreed to by the authorizing agent. If the authorizing agent agrees to  
30 take possession and does not take possession of the remains within thirty  
31 days after cremation or on an agreed date, the crematory shall send written  
32 notice to the last known address of the authorizing agent to take possession.  
33 Ninety days after the notification is sent or delivered, the crematory may  
34 dispose of the cremated or processed remains in any legal manner.

35 8. Unless the deceased has prepared a document pursuant to section  
36 32-1365.01, the crematory shall obtain an authorization to cremate from the  
37 authorizing agent that shall contain a provision holding the crematory  
38 harmless for the disposition of unclaimed cremated or processed remains.

39 9. All employees of the crematory who handle dead human bodies shall  
40 use universal precautions and shall otherwise exercise reasonable care to  
41 minimize the risk of transmitting any communicable disease from a dead human  
42 body.

43 10. Unless the deceased has prepared a document pursuant to section  
44 32-1365.01, employees of the crematory shall not remove a dead human body  
45 from the container in which it is delivered to the crematory without the

1 express written consent of the authorizing agent. If, after accepting a dead  
2 human body for cremation, employees of a crematory discover that a mechanical  
3 or radioactive device is implanted in the body, an embalmer licensed pursuant  
4 to article 2 of this chapter shall remove the device from the body before  
5 cremation takes place.

6 11. A crematory shall keep an accurate record of all cremations  
7 performed, including dispositions of cremated and processed remains, for not  
8 fewer than five years after the cremation.
