CHAPTER 206

HOUSE BILL 2185

AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR PLACEMENT OF MEMORIAL SUPPORTING ENDURING FREEDOM IN WESLEY BOLIN PLAZA.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Enduring freedom memorial; procedures

3 A. A memorial supporting enduring freedom may be placed in Wesley
4 Bolin plaza pursuant to the following procedure:

5 1. The proponents shall submit a concept to the department of
6 administration for the design, dimensions and proposed location of the
7 memorial.

8 2. The department of administration shall review the concept and
9 determine the most appropriate location that highlights the memorial and
10 preserves the integrity of Wesley Bolin plaza.

11 3. The department of administration shall submit its review and
12 recommendations to the legislative governmental mall commission established
13 by section 41-1361, Arizona Revised Statutes, including recommendations
14 regarding the department's ability to maintain the memorial.

15 4. After recommendations from the historical advisory commission
16 established by section 41-1352, Arizona Revised Statutes, regarding the
17 historical integrity of the memorial and after any necessary negotiations
18 with the proponents, the legislative governmental mall commission, in
19 consultation with the department of administration, shall approve the final
20 design, dimensions, location and maintenance requirements of the memorial.

21 5. Before the beginning of construction of the memorial, the
22 proponents shall enter into a contract with the department of administration
23 that specifies the conditions of the design, dimensions, location and
24 maintenance of the memorial and that includes a list of contractors and
25 subcontractors that will be employed and a verification that all employees
26 for the project are insured and that this state is indemnified against any
27 liability in regard to the construction.

28 6. The memorial shall be completed and dedicated to this state within
29 two years after the effective date of this act.

30 B. All fund-raising and contracts for artistic design and construction
31 of the memorial are the sole responsibility of the proponents. This state
32 shall not facilitate fund-raising or establish a state fund for the deposit
33 of the monies. Public monies shall not be used for the design or
34 construction of the memorial.

35 Sec. 2. Delayed repeal

36 This act is repealed from and after December 31, 2006.
