HOUSE BILL 2426

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 41-618, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; REPEALING SECTION 41-3005.02, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 41, CHAPTER 27, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 41-3015.01; RELATING TO THE CONSTITUTIONAL COMMEMORATION COMMITTEE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 41-618, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 41-618. Constitutional commemoration committee; definition

5 A. The constitutional commemoration committee is established
6 consisting of:

7 1. Two members of the house of representatives as advisory members who
8 are appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and who may not
9 be from the same political party.

10 2. Two members of the senate as advisory members who are appointed by
11 the president of the senate and who may not be from the same political party.

12 3. The governor or the governor's designee.

13 4. The superintendent of public instruction or the superintendent's
14 designee.

15 5. Six public members, two ~~who~~ OF WHOM are appointed by the governor,
16 two ~~who~~ OF WHOM are appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives
17 and two ~~who~~ OF WHOM are appointed by the president of the senate.

18 B. The members of the committee annually shall elect a chairman and
19 vice-chairman from among its members. Members are not eligible to receive
20 compensation but are eligible to receive reimbursement of expenses under
21 title 38, chapter 4, article 2. Except advisory members of the state
22 legislature, members shall serve four year terms.

23 C. Legislative ~~council~~ STAFF shall provide ~~staff~~ and operational
24 support to the committee.

25 D. The committee shall:

26 1. Collaborate and cooperate with public, private and nonprofit
27 entities to promote public understanding of the Constitution of the United
28 States and, the Bill of Rights AND THE ADDITIONAL AMENDMENTS, INCLUDING THOSE
29 THAT MADE ADVANCEMENTS IN CIVIL RIGHTS AND OTHER PERSONAL LIBERTIES.

30 2. Promote and sponsor observances in this state commemorating and
31 celebrating historical events that encourage youth and adult civic
32 participation.

33 3. Support expanding existing programs that promote civic
34 participation and educate school-age children.

35 E. The committee may accept, spend and account for donations, gifts,
36 bequests and devises that are consistent with the overall purpose and
37 objectives of the committee.

38 F. For THE purposes of this section, "advisory member" means a member
39 who gives advice to other members of the committee at meetings of the
40 committee but who is not eligible to vote and is not a member for determining
41 whether a quorum is present.

42 Sec. 2. Repeal

43 Section 41-3005.02, Arizona Revised Statutes, is repealed.
