CHAPTER 227

SENATE BILL 1014

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 12, CHAPTER 6, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING ARTICLE 16;
AMENDING TITLE 13, CHAPTER 37, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION
13-3726; RELATING TO THE RIGHT OF PUBLICITY.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 12, chapter 6, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended
3 by adding article 16, to read:

4 ARTICLE 16. RIGHT OF PUBLICITY

5 12-761. Right of publicity; unauthorized use of the name,
6 portrait or picture of a soldier; exception;
7 definition

8 A. THE RIGHT TO CONTROL AND TO CHOOSE WHETHER AND HOW TO USE A
9 SOLDIER'S NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES IS RECOGNIZED AS
10 EACH SOLDIER'S RIGHT OF PUBLICITY.

11 B. A PERSON IS LIABLE FOR USING THE NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE OF ANY
12 SOLDIER WITHOUT HAVING OBTAINED PRIOR CONSENT TO THE USE BY THE SOLDIER OR BY
13 THE SOLDIER'S SPOUSE, IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBER, TRUSTEE IF THE SOLDIER IS A
14 MINOR OR LEGALLY DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE IF THE PERSON USES THE NAME,
15 PORTRAIT OR PICTURE FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

- 16 1. ADVERTISING FOR THE SALE OF ANY GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE.
- 17 2. SOLICITING PATRONAGE FOR ANY BUSINESS.
- 18 3. RECEIVING CONSIDERATION FOR THE SALE OF ANY GOODS, WARES OR
19 MERCHANDISE.

20 C. A PERSON WHO USES THE NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE OF A SOLDIER FOR A
21 PROHIBITED PURPOSE WITHOUT PRIOR CONSENT FROM THE SOLDIER OR A PERSON WHO MAY
22 ENFORCE THE SOLDIER'S RIGHTS AND REMEDIES IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:

- 23 1. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF TO PREVENT OR RESTRAIN THE UNAUTHORIZED USE.
- 24 2. TREBLE DAMAGES.
- 25 3. PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES.
- 26 4. ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS.

27 D. IN CALCULATING DAMAGES, ANY PROFITS FROM THE UNAUTHORIZED USE THAT
28 ARE ATTRIBUTABLE TO THAT USE SHALL BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT.

29 E. THE RIGHTS AND REMEDIES PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION SUPPLEMENT ANY
30 OTHER RIGHTS AND REMEDIES PROVIDED BY LAW, INCLUDING THE COMMON LAW RIGHT OF
31 PRIVACY.

32 F. ANY CLAIM FOR RELIEF THAT IS REQUESTED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION
33 SHALL BE BROUGHT WITHIN FIVE YEARS AFTER THE UNAUTHORIZED PUBLICATION.

34 G. THE RIGHT OF PUBLICITY IS A PROPERTY RIGHT THAT SURVIVES A
35 SOLDIER'S DEATH. ON THE SOLDIER'S DEATH, ONLY THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS MAY
36 ENFORCE THE SOLDIER'S RIGHTS AND REMEDIES IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- 37 1. THE SOLDIER'S LEGALLY DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE.
- 38 2. THE SOLDIER'S SPOUSE.
- 39 3. THE SOLDIER'S PARENTS.
- 40 4. THE SOLDIER'S CHILDREN.
- 41 5. THE SOLDIER'S GRANDCHILDREN.

42 H. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE FOLLOWING:

- 43 1. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE IN AN ATTEMPT TO
44 PORTRAY, DESCRIBE OR IMPERSONATE THAT SOLDIER IN A LIVE PERFORMANCE, A SINGLE
45 AND ORIGINAL WORK OF FINE ART, A PLAY, BOOK, ARTICLE, MUSICAL WORK OR FILM OR

1 ON RADIO, TELEVISION OR OTHER AUDIO OR AUDIOVISUAL WORK IF THE PERFORMANCE,
2 MUSICAL WORK, PLAY, BOOK, ARTICLE OR FILM DOES NOT ITSELF CONSTITUTE A
3 COMMERCIAL ADVERTISEMENT FOR ANY GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE.

4 2. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE FOR NONCOMMERCIAL
5 PURPOSES, INCLUDING ANY NEWS, PUBLIC AFFAIRS OR SPORTS BROADCAST OR ACCOUNT.

6 3. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME IN TRUTHFULLY IDENTIFYING THE SOLDIER
7 AS THE AUTHOR OF A PARTICULAR WORK OR PROGRAM OR AS THE PERFORMER IN A
8 PARTICULAR PERFORMANCE.

9 4. ANY PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS, ADVERTISEMENTS OR COMMERCIAL
10 ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR A USE DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 1, 2 OR 3 OF THIS SUBSECTION.

11 5. THE USE OF PHOTOGRAPHS, VIDEO RECORDINGS AND IMAGES BY A PERSON,
12 FIRM OR CORPORATION PRACTICING THE PROFESSION OF PHOTOGRAPHY TO EXHIBIT, IN
13 OR ABOUT THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER'S PLACE OF BUSINESS OR PORTFOLIO,
14 SPECIMENS OF THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER'S WORK, UNLESS THE EXHIBITION IS
15 CONTINUED BY THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER AFTER WRITTEN NOTICE OBJECTING TO
16 THE EXHIBITION BY THE PORTRAYED SOLDIER OR A PERSON WHO MAY ENFORCE THE
17 SOLDIER'S RIGHTS AND REMEDIES.

18 6. A SOLDIER'S PICTURE OR PORTRAIT THAT IS NOT FACIALLY IDENTIFIABLE.

19 7. A PHOTOGRAPH OF A MONUMENT OR A MEMORIAL THAT IS PLACED ON ANY
20 GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE.

21 I. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "SOLDIER" MEANS ANY ACTIVE DUTY
22 MEMBER OR FORMER MEMBER OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING
23 ANY MEMBER WHO WAS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.

24 Sec. 2. Title 13, chapter 37, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended by
25 adding section 13-3726, to read:

26 13-3726. Unauthorized use of the name, portrait or picture of a
27 deceased soldier; civil action; exceptions;
28 violation; classification; definition

29 A. A PERSON SHALL NOT KNOWINGLY USE THE NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE OF A
30 DECEASED SOLDIER FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADVERTISING FOR THE SALE OF ANY GOODS,
31 WARES OR MERCHANDISE OR FOR THE SOLICITATION OF PATRONAGE FOR ANY BUSINESS
32 WITHOUT HAVING OBTAINED PRIOR CONSENT TO THE USE BY THE SOLDIER OR BY THE
33 SOLDIER'S SPOUSE, IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBER, TRUSTEE IF THE SOLDIER IS A MINOR
34 OR LEGALLY DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE.

35 B. ANY PERSON WHO IS INJURED BY THE USE OF THE NAME, PORTRAIT OR
36 PICTURE OF A DECEASED SOLDIER IN VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION
37 MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST THE PERSON WHO COMMITTED THE VIOLATION
38 PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-761.

39 C. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE FOLLOWING:

40 1. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE IN AN ATTEMPT TO
41 PORTRAY, DESCRIBE OR IMPERSONATE THAT SOLDIER IN A LIVE PERFORMANCE, A SINGLE
42 AND ORIGINAL WORK OF FINE ART, A PLAY, BOOK, ARTICLE, MUSICAL WORK OR FILM OR
43 ON RADIO, TELEVISION OR OTHER AUDIO OR AUDIOVISUAL WORK IF THE PERFORMANCE,
44 MUSICAL WORK, PLAY, BOOK, ARTICLE OR FILM DOES NOT ITSELF CONSTITUTE A
45 COMMERCIAL ADVERTISEMENT FOR ANY GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE.

1 2. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME, PORTRAIT OR PICTURE FOR NONCOMMERCIAL
2 PURPOSES, INCLUDING ANY NEWS, PUBLIC AFFAIRS OR SPORTS BROADCAST OR ACCOUNT.
3 3. THE USE OF A SOLDIER'S NAME IN TRUTHFULLY IDENTIFYING THE SOLDIER
4 AS THE AUTHOR OF A PARTICULAR WORK OR PROGRAM OR AS THE PERFORMER IN A
5 PARTICULAR PERFORMANCE.
6 4. ANY PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS, ADVERTISEMENTS OR COMMERCIAL
7 ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR A USE DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 1, 2 OR 3.
8 5. THE USE OF PHOTOGRAPHS, VIDEO RECORDINGS AND IMAGES BY A PERSON,
9 FIRM OR CORPORATION PRACTICING THE PROFESSION OF PHOTOGRAPHY TO EXHIBIT, IN
10 OR ABOUT THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER'S PLACE OF BUSINESS OR PORTFOLIO,
11 SPECIMENS OF THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER'S WORK, UNLESS THE EXHIBITION IS
12 CONTINUED BY THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER AFTER WRITTEN NOTICE OBJECTING TO
13 THE EXHIBITION BY THE PORTRAYED SOLDIER OR A PERSON WHO MAY ENFORCE THE
14 SOLDIER'S RIGHTS AND REMEDIES.
15 6. A SOLDIER'S PICTURE OR PORTRAIT THAT IS NOT FACIALLY IDENTIFIABLE.
16 7. A PHOTOGRAPH OF A MONUMENT OR A MEMORIAL THAT IS PLACED ON ANY
17 GOODS, WARES OR MERCHANDISE.
18 D. A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A CLASS 1
19 MISDEMEANOR.
20 E. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "SOLDIER" MEANS ANY ACTIVE DUTY
21 MEMBER OR FORMER MEMBER OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING
22 ANY MEMBER WHO WAS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
23 Sec. 3. Severability
24 If a provision of this act or its application to any person or
25 circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions
26 or applications of the act that can be given effect without the invalid
27 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
28 severable.
29 Sec. 4. Emergency
30 This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the
31 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by
32 law.
