SENATE BILL 1146

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 12, ARTICLE 4, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; BY ADDING SECTION 15-1474; RELATING TO EXPENDITURE LIMITATIONS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 15, chapter 12, article 4, Arizona Revised Statutes,
3 is amended by adding section 15-1474, to read:

4 15-1474. Community college bookstore revenue; expenditure
5 limitation; penalty

6 NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 41-1279.07, IF A COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT
7 EXCEEDS ITS EXPENDITURE LIMITATION PRESCRIBED IN ARTICLE IX, SECTION 21,
8 CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA, DUE TO THE EXPENDITURE OF REVENUES FROM AMOUNTS
9 RECEIVED FROM RETAIL TRANSACTIONS AT BOOKSTORES OPERATED BY A COMMUNITY
10 COLLEGE DISTRICT, THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL NOT HAVE ANY STATE AID PURSUANT
11 TO SECTION 15-1466 WITHHELD AND THE PENALTY FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION
12 SHALL BE ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

13 Sec. 2. Town of Pima; penalties for exceeding expenditure
14 limitation

15 The penalties prescribed by section 41-1279.07, subsections G and H,
16 Arizona Revised Statutes, for excess expenditures of local revenues by the
17 town of Pima in fiscal year 2006-2007 shall equal \$93,904 and are payable
18 pursuant to section 41-1279.07, subsection G, Arizona Revised Statutes, in
19 equal annual installments over five fiscal years beginning in fiscal year
20 2009-2010.

21 Sec. 3. Delayed repeal

22 Section 15-1474, Arizona Revised Statutes, as added by this act, is
23 repealed from and after June 30, 2019.

24 Sec. 4. Retroactivity

25 This act is effective retroactively to from and after June 30, 2009.
