6 41-3022.09. Arizona medical board; termination July 1, 2022
7 A. THE ARIZONA MEDICAL BOARD TERMINATES ON JULY 1, 2022.
8 B. TITLE 32, CHAPTER 13 IS REPEALED ON JANUARY 1, 2023.
9 Sec. 3. Purpose
10 Pursuant to section 41-2955, subsection B, Arizona Revised Statutes,
11 the legislature continues the Arizona medical board to promote the safe and
12 professional practice of allopathic medicine.
13 Sec. 4. Retroactivity
14 Sections 1 and 2 of this act are effective retroactively to July 1,
15 2012.
