CHAPTER 108

HOUSE BILL 2862

AN ACT

MAKING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING
COMMISSION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Supplemental appropriation; independent redistricting
3 commission; exemption; report

4 A. In addition to the appropriation made by Laws 2011, chapter 24,
5 section 50, the sum of \$700,000 is appropriated from the state general fund
6 in fiscal year 2011-2012 to the independent redistricting commission for the
7 operating expenses of the commission.

8 B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt
9 from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to
10 lapsing of appropriations, except that any monies remaining unspent on June
11 30, 2013 shall revert to the state general fund.

12 C. Within ninety days after the effective date of this section, the
13 auditor general shall report on the fiscal years 2010-2011 and 2011-2012
14 revenues and all paid and accrued expenditures incurred by the independent
15 redistricting commission, including a description of and the purpose for
16 professional and outside services, travel, other operating expenses, capital
17 equipment and noncapital equipment. On completion, the auditor general shall
18 submit the report to the governor, the president of the senate, the speaker
19 of the house of representatives, and the secretary of state.

20 D. The department of administration, consistent with its
21 constitutional fiscal oversight authority of the independent redistricting
22 commission, shall report at least monthly to the appropriations chairpersons
23 of the senate and the house of representatives as to whether the expenditures
24 made by the independent redistricting commission established in 2011 are
25 necessary and lawful.
