## **SENATE BILL 1343**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 28-2351 AND 28-2403, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 28, CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 12, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 28-2449; RENUMBERING SECTIONS 28-2451, 28-2452, 28-2453, 28-2454 AND 28-2455, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS SECTIONS 28-2471, 28-2472, 28-2473, 28-2474 AND 28-2475, RESPECTIVELY; AMENDING SECTIONS 28-6501, 28-6991, 28-6993, 41-603 AND 41-608, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 28-2351, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 28-2351. License plate provided; design

5 A. The department shall provide to every owner one license plate for  
6 each vehicle registered. At the request of the owner and on payment of any  
7 required fee, the department shall provide either one or two license plates  
8 for a vehicle for which a special plate is requested pursuant to this  
9 chapter, except that the department shall provide one license plate if the  
10 special plate is issued pursuant to section 28-2416 or 28-2416.01.

11 B. The license plate shall display the number assigned to the vehicle  
12 and to the owner of the vehicle and the name of this state, which may be  
13 abbreviated. The director shall coat the license plate with a reflective  
14 material that is consistent with the determination of the department  
15 regarding the color and design of license plates and special plates. The  
16 director shall design the license plate and the letters and numerals on the  
17 license plate to be of sufficient size to be plainly readable during daylight  
18 from a distance of one hundred feet. In addition to the standard license  
19 plate issued for a trailer before August 12, 2005, the director shall issue a  
20 license plate for trailers that has a design that is similar to the standard  
21 size license plate for trailers but that is the same size as the license  
22 plate for motorcycles. The trailer owner shall notify the department which  
23 size license plate the owner wants for the trailer.

24 C. Notwithstanding any other law, the department shall not contract  
25 with a nongovernmental entity to purchase or secure reflective material for  
26 the plates issued by the department unless the department has made a  
27 reasonable effort to secure qualified bids or proposals from as many  
28 individual responsible respondents as possible.

29 D. The department shall determine the color and design of the license  
30 plate. All other plates issued by the department, except the plates issued  
31 pursuant to sections 28-2404, 28-2412, 28-2413, 28-2414, 28-2416, 28-2416.01,  
32 28-2417 through ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449, ~~28-2452~~ 28-2472, ~~28-2453~~ 28-2473, ~~28-2454~~  
33 28-2474 and ~~28-2455~~ 28-2475 and article 14 of this chapter, shall be the same  
34 color as and similar in design to the license plate as determined by the  
35 department.

36 E. A passenger motor vehicle rented without a driver shall receive the  
37 same type of license plate as issued for a private passenger motor vehicle.

38 Sec. 2. Section 28-2403, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

39 28-2403. Special plates; transfers; violation; classification

40 A. Except as otherwise provided in this article, the department shall  
41 issue or renew special plates in lieu of the regular license plates pursuant  
42 to the following conditions and procedures and only if the requirements  
43 prescribed by this article for the requested special plates are met:

1           1. Except as provided in sections 28-2416 and 28-2416.01, a person who  
2 is the registered owner of a vehicle registered with the department or who  
3 applies for an original or renewal registration of a vehicle may submit to  
4 the department a completed application form as prescribed by the department  
5 with the fee prescribed by section 28-2402 for special plates in addition to  
6 the registration fee prescribed by section 28-2003.

7           2. Except for plates issued pursuant to sections 28-2404, 28-2412,  
8 28-2413, 28-2414, 28-2416, 28-2416.01, 28-2417 through ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449,  
9 ~~28-2452~~ 28-2472, ~~28-2453~~ 28-2473, ~~28-2454~~ 28-2474 and ~~28-2455~~ 28-2475 and  
10 article 14 of this chapter, the special plates shall be the same color as and  
11 similar to the design of the regular license plates that is determined by the  
12 department.

13           3. Except as provided in section 28-2416, the department shall issue  
14 special plates only to the owner or lessee of a vehicle that is currently  
15 registered, including any vehicle that has a declared gross weight, as  
16 defined in section 28-5431, of twenty-six thousand pounds or less.

17           4. Except as provided in sections 28-2416 and 28-2416.01, the  
18 department shall charge the fee prescribed by section 28-2402 for each annual  
19 renewal of special plates in addition to the registration fee prescribed by  
20 section 28-2003.

21           B. Except as provided in sections 28-2416 and 28-2416.01, on  
22 notification to the department and on payment of the transfer fee prescribed  
23 by section 28-2402, a person who is issued special plates may transfer the  
24 special plates to another vehicle the person owns or leases. Persons who are  
25 issued special plates for hearing impaired persons pursuant to section  
26 28-2408 and international symbol of access special plates pursuant to section  
27 28-2409 are exempt from the transfer fee. If a person who is issued special  
28 plates sells, trades or otherwise releases ownership of the vehicle on which  
29 the plates have been displayed, the person shall immediately report the  
30 transfer of the plates to the department or the person shall surrender the  
31 plates to the department as prescribed by the director. It is unlawful for a  
32 person to whom the plates have been issued to knowingly permit them to be  
33 displayed on a vehicle except the vehicle authorized by the department.

34           C. The special plates shall be affixed to the vehicle for which  
35 registration is sought in lieu of the regular license plates.

36           D. A person is guilty of a class 3 misdemeanor who:

37           1. Violates subsection B of this section.

38           2. Fraudulently gives false or fictitious information in the  
39 application for or renewal of special plates or placards issued pursuant to  
40 this article.

41           3. Conceals a material fact or otherwise commits fraud in the  
42 application for or renewal of special plates or placards issued pursuant to  
43 this article.

1           Sec. 3. Title 28, chapter 7, article 12, Arizona Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding section 28-2449, to read:

3           28-2449. Girls' youth organization special plates; fund

4           A. IF, BY DECEMBER 31, 2013, AN ENTITY PAYS THIRTY-TWO THOUSAND  
5 DOLLARS TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION, THE  
6 DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE GIRLS' YOUTH ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATES. THE ENTITY  
7 THAT PROVIDES THE THIRTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS SHALL DESIGN THE GIRLS' YOUTH  
8 ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATES. THE DESIGN AND COLOR OF THE GIRLS' YOUTH  
9 ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATES ARE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT.  
10 THE DIRECTOR MAY ALLOW A REQUEST FOR GIRLS' YOUTH ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATES  
11 TO BE COMBINED WITH A REQUEST FOR PERSONALIZED SPECIAL PLATES. IF THE  
12 DIRECTOR ALLOWS SUCH A COMBINATION, THE REQUEST SHALL BE IN A FORM PRESCRIBED  
13 BY THE DIRECTOR AND IS SUBJECT TO THE FEES FOR THE PERSONALIZED SPECIAL  
14 PLATES IN ADDITION TO THE FEES REQUIRED FOR THE GIRLS' YOUTH ORGANIZATION  
15 SPECIAL PLATES.

16           B. OF THE TWENTY-FIVE DOLLAR FEE REQUIRED BY SECTION 28-2402 FOR THE  
17 ORIGINAL SPECIAL PLATES AND FOR RENEWAL OF SPECIAL PLATES, EIGHT DOLLARS IS A  
18 SPECIAL PLATE ADMINISTRATION FEE AND SEVENTEEN DOLLARS IS AN ANNUAL DONATION.

19           C. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEPOSIT, PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 35-146 AND  
20 35-147, ALL SPECIAL PLATE ADMINISTRATION FEES IN THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND  
21 ESTABLISHED BY SECTION 28-6991 AND ALL DONATIONS COLLECTED PURSUANT TO THIS  
22 SECTION IN THE GIRLS' YOUTH ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATE FUND ESTABLISHED BY  
23 THIS SECTION.

24           D. THE GIRLS' YOUTH ORGANIZATION SPECIAL PLATE FUND IS ESTABLISHED  
25 CONSISTING OF MONIES DEPOSITED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE DIRECTOR SHALL  
26 ADMINISTER THE FUND. MONIES IN THE FUND ARE CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED.

27           E. THE DIRECTOR SHALL ANNUALLY ALLOCATE MONIES FROM THE FUND TO THE  
28 ENTITY IN THIS STATE THAT PAID THE IMPLEMENTATION FEE TO THE DEPARTMENT  
29 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION. THE ENTITY MUST BE AN INCORPORATED  
30 NONPROFIT CORPORATION THAT IS QUALIFIED UNDER SECTION 501(c)(3) OF THE UNITED  
31 STATES INTERNAL REVENUE CODE FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES AND THAT  
32 PROVIDES A PROGRAM FOR YOUNG GIRLS THAT BUILDS GIRLS OF COURAGE, CONFIDENCE  
33 AND CHARACTER WHO MAKE THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE. THE INCORPORATED NONPROFIT  
34 CORPORATION MUST HAVE BEEN IN EXISTENCE FOR AT LEAST ONE CENTURY AND MUST  
35 HELP GIRLS DISCOVER THE FUN, FRIENDSHIP AND POWER OF GIRLS TOGETHER. THE  
36 PROGRAM MUST:

37           1. INCLUDE A MYRIAD OF ENRICHING EXPERIENCES, SUCH AS EXTRAORDINARY  
38 FIELD TRIPS, SPORTS SKILL-BUILDING CLINICS, COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS,  
39 CULTURAL EXCHANGES AND ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIPS, THAT HELP THE GIRLS GROW  
40 COURAGEOUS AND STRONG.

41           2. HELP GIRLS DEVELOP THEIR FULL INDIVIDUAL POTENTIAL, RELATE TO  
42 OTHERS WITH INCREASING UNDERSTANDING, SKILL AND RESPECT, DEVELOP VALUES TO  
43 GUIDE THEIR ACTIONS AND TO PROVIDE THE FOUNDATION FOR SOUND DECISION MAKING  
44 AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE IMPROVEMENT OF SOCIETY THROUGH THEIR ABILITIES,  
45 LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND COOPERATION WITH OTHERS.

1 F. ON NOTICE FROM THE DIRECTOR, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST AND  
2 DIVEST MONIES IN THE FUND AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 35-313, AND MONIES EARNED  
3 FROM INVESTMENT SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE FUND.

8 Sec. 5. Section 28-6501, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
9 28-6501. Definition of highway user revenues

10 In this article, unless the context otherwise requires or except as  
11 otherwise provided by statute, "highway user revenues" means all monies  
12 received in this state from licenses, taxes, penalties, interest and fees  
13 authorized by the following:

14 1. Chapters 2, 7, 8 and 15 of this title, except for:

15 (a) The special plate administration fees prescribed in sections  
16 28-2404, 28-2412 through ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449 and 28-2514.

17 (b) The donations prescribed in sections 28-2404, 28-2412 through  
18 28-2415, 28-2417 through ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449, ~~28-2453~~ 28-2473, ~~28-2454~~ 28-2474  
19 and ~~28-2455~~ 28-2475.

20 2. Section 28-1177.

21 3. Chapters 10 and 11 of this title.

22 4. Chapter 16, articles 1, 2 and 4 of this title, except as provided  
23 in sections 28-5926 and 28-5927.

24 Sec. 6. Section 28-6991, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
25 28-6991. State highway fund; sources

26 A state highway fund is established that consists of:

27 1. Monies distributed from the Arizona highway user revenue fund  
28 pursuant to chapter 18 of this title.

29 2. Monies appropriated by the legislature.

30 3. Monies received from donations for the construction, improvement or  
31 maintenance of state highways or bridges. These monies shall be credited to  
32 a special account and shall be spent only for the purpose indicated by the  
33 donor.

34 4. Monies received from counties under cooperative agreements,  
35 including proceeds from bond issues. The state treasurer shall deposit these  
36 monies to the credit of the fund in a special account on delivery to the  
37 treasurer of a concise written agreement between the department and the  
38 county stating the purposes for which the monies are surrendered by the  
39 county, and these monies shall be spent only as stated in the agreement.

40 5. Monies received from the United States under an act of Congress to  
41 provide aid for the construction of rural post roads, but monies received on  
42 projects for which the monies necessary to be provided by this state are  
43 wholly derived from sources mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 of this section  
44 shall be allotted by the department and deposited by the state treasurer in  
45 the special account within the fund established for each project. On

1 completion of the project, on the satisfaction and discharge in full of all  
2 obligations of any kind created and on request of the department, the  
3 treasurer shall transfer the unexpended balance in the special account for  
4 the project into the state highway fund, and the unexpended balance and any  
5 further federal aid thereafter received on account of the project may be  
6 spent under the general provisions of this title.

7 6. Monies in the custody of an officer or agent of this state from any  
8 source that is to be used for the construction, improvement or maintenance of  
9 state highways or bridges.

10 7. Monies deposited in the state general fund and arising from the  
11 disposal of state personal property belonging to the department.

12 8. Receipts from the sale or disposal of any or all other property  
13 held by the department and purchased with state highway monies.

14 9. Monies generated pursuant to section 28-410.

15 10. Monies distributed pursuant to section 28-5808, subsection B,  
16 paragraph 2, subdivision (d).

17 11. Monies deposited pursuant to sections 28-1143, 28-2353 and 28-3003.

18 12. Except as provided in section 28-5101, the following monies:

19 (a) Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-2206 and section 28-5808,  
20 subsection B, paragraph 2, subdivision (e).

21 (b) One dollar of each registration fee and one dollar of each title  
22 fee collected pursuant to section 28-2003.

23 (c) Two dollars of each late registration penalty collected by the  
24 director pursuant to section 28-2162.

25 (d) The air quality compliance fee collected pursuant to section  
26 49-542.

27 (e) The special plate administration fees collected pursuant to  
28 sections 28-2404, 28-2412 through 28-2416, 28-2416.01, 28-2417 through  
29 ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449 and 28-2514.

30 (f) Monies collected pursuant to sections 28-372, 28-2155 and 28-2156  
31 if the director is the registering officer.

32 13. Monies deposited pursuant to chapter 5, article 5 of this title.

33 14. Donations received pursuant to section 28-2269.

34 15. Dealer and registration monies collected pursuant to section  
35 28-4304.

36 16. Abandoned vehicle administration monies deposited pursuant to  
37 section 28-4804.

38 17. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-710, subsection D,  
39 paragraph 2.

40 18. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-2065.

41 19. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-7311.

42 20. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-7059.

43 21. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-1105.

44 22. Monies deposited pursuant to section 28-2448, subsection D.

1           Sec. 7. Section 28-6993, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
2           28-6993. State highway fund; authorized uses

3           A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section and section  
4 28-6538, the state highway fund shall be used for any of the following  
5 purposes in strict conformity with and subject to the budget as provided by  
6 this section and by sections 28-6997 through 28-7003:

7           1. To pay salaries, wages, necessary travel expenses and other  
8 expenses of officers and employees of the department and the incidental  
9 office expenses, including telegraph, telephone, postal and express charges  
10 and printing, stationery and advertising expenses.

11           2. To pay for both:

12           (a) Equipment, supplies, machines, tools, department offices and  
13 laboratories established by the department.

14           (b) The construction and repair of buildings or yards of the  
15 department.

16           3. To pay the cost of both:

17           (a) Engineering, construction, improvement and maintenance of state  
18 highways and parts of highways forming state routes.

19           (b) Highways under cooperative agreements with the United States that  
20 are entered into pursuant to this chapter and an act of Congress providing  
21 for the construction of rural post roads.

22           4. To pay land damages incurred by reason of establishing, opening,  
23 altering, relocating, widening or abandoning portions of a state route or  
24 state highway.

25           5. To reimburse the department revolving account.

26           6. To pay premiums on authorized indemnity bonds and on compensation  
27 insurance under the workers' compensation act.

28           7. To defray lawful expenses and costs required to administer and  
29 carry out the intent, purposes and provisions of this title, including  
30 repayment of obligations entered into pursuant to this title, payment of  
31 interest on obligations entered into pursuant to this title, repayment of  
32 loans and other financial assistance, including repayment of advances and  
33 interest on advances made to the department pursuant to section 28-7677, and  
34 payment of all other obligations and expenses of the board and department  
35 pursuant to chapter 21 of this title.

36           8. To pay lawful bills and charges incurred by the state engineer.

37           9. To acquire, construct or improve entry roads to state parks or  
38 roads within state parks.

39           10. To acquire, construct or improve entry roads to state prisons.

40           11. To pay the cost of relocating a utility facility pursuant to  
41 section 28-7156.

42           12. For the purposes provided in subsections C, D and E of this section  
43 and sections 28-1143, 28-2353 and 28-3003.

44           13. To pay the cost of issuing an Arizona centennial special plate  
45 pursuant to section 28-2448.

1           B. For each fiscal year, the department of transportation shall  
2 allocate and transfer monies in the state highway fund to the department of  
3 public safety for funding a portion of highway patrol costs in eight  
4 installments in each of the first eight months of a fiscal year that do not  
5 exceed ten million dollars.

6           C. Subject to legislative appropriation, the department may use the  
7 monies in the state highway fund as prescribed in section 28-6991, paragraph  
8 12 to carry out the duties imposed by this title for registration or titling  
9 of vehicles, to operate joint title, registration and driver licensing  
10 offices, to cover the administrative costs of issuing the air quality  
11 compliance sticker, modifying the year validating tab and issuing the  
12 windshield sticker and to cover expenses and costs in issuing special plates  
13 pursuant to sections 28-2404, 28-2412 through ~~28-2448~~ 28-2449 and 28-2514.

14           D. The department shall use monies deposited in the state highway fund  
15 pursuant to chapter 5, article 5 of this title only as prescribed by that  
16 article.

17           E. Monies deposited in the state highway fund pursuant to section  
18 28-2269 shall be used only as prescribed by that section.

19           F. Monies deposited in the state highway fund pursuant to section  
20 28-710, subsection D, paragraph 2 shall only be used for state highway work  
21 zone traffic control devices.

22           G. The department may exchange monies distributed to the state highway  
23 fund pursuant to section 28-6538, subsection A, paragraph 1 for local  
24 government surface transportation program federal monies suballocated to  
25 councils of government and metropolitan planning organizations if the local  
26 government scheduled to receive the federal monies concurs. An exchange of  
27 state highway fund monies pursuant to this subsection shall be in an amount  
28 that is at least equal to ninety per cent of the federal obligation authority  
29 that exists in the project for which the exchange is proposed.

30           Sec. 8. Section 41-603, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
31 41-603. Powers and duties

32           A. The department may act as guardian of an incapacitated veteran, the  
33 incapacitated spouse of a veteran or minor children of a veteran, or as  
34 conservator of the estate of a protected veteran or of the veteran's  
35 incapacitated or surviving spouse or of the minor children of a veteran. The  
36 department may act in all fiduciary matters, including as power of attorney,  
37 trustee, custodian or representative payee of a veteran, spouse of a veteran  
38 or minor child of a veteran. The department may act as the personal  
39 representative of the estate of a deceased veteran, deceased spouse of a  
40 veteran or deceased child of a veteran.

41           B. The department shall:

42           1. Assist veterans and their families and dependents in presenting,  
43 providing and establishing claims, privileges, rights and benefits they may  
44 have under federal, state or local law.

1           2. Inform veterans and their families and dependents and military and  
2 civilian authorities about federal, state and local laws enacted to benefit  
3 veterans and their families and dependents and members of the armed forces.

4           3. Collect information relating to services and facilities available  
5 to veterans.

6           4. Cooperate with all government and private agencies receiving  
7 services for or benefits to veterans and their families and dependents.

8           5. Conduct administrative reviews and, if possible, correct abuses or  
9 prevent exploitation of veterans and their families or dependents and  
10 recommend corrective legislation.

11          6. Adopt rules deemed necessary to administer this article.

12          7. Enter into agreements with veterans' organizations in this state  
13 holding a charter granted by the Congress of the United States for the  
14 beneficial interest of veterans.

15          8. Verify and provide written confirmation to the person of  
16 eligibility for special license plates issued pursuant to section ~~28-2455~~  
17 ~~28-2475~~ by determining that all of the following are true:

18           (a) The person was a member of the United States armed forces on  
19 December 7, 1941.

20           (b) The person received an honorable discharge from the United States  
21 armed forces.

22           (c) The person was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours of  
23 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m., Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the Island of Oahu or  
24 offshore, at a distance not exceeding three miles.

25          9. Evaluate, supervise, approve and disapprove programs offered by  
26 educational institutions and training establishments pursuant to United  
27 States Code titles 10 and 38 and state rules, so that veterans and their  
28 dependents may draw the educational allowance provided by federal law while  
29 pursuing approved programs.

30          C. The department may:

31           1. Acquire property for and construct and operate a veterans' home  
32 facility in southern Arizona.

33           2. Acquire property for and establish and operate cemeteries for  
34 veterans in this state.

35           3. Establish a training center to provide training to current or  
36 potential employees and the veteran community. The department may establish  
37 a fee for this training.

38           4. Award the Arizona gold star military medal, if appropriate and if  
39 funding is available.

40          Sec. 9. Section 41-608, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

41          41-608. Veterans' donations fund; grants

42          A. The veterans' donations fund is established consisting of monies,  
43 gifts and contributions donated to the department and monies deposited  
44 pursuant to sections 28-2414, 28-2428, 28-2431, 28-2447, ~~28-2453~~ 28-2473,  
45 ~~28-2454~~ 28-2474, ~~28-2455~~ 28-2475 and 43-620. The department shall administer

1 the fund. Monies in the fund are continuously appropriated. The monies in  
2 the fund are exempt from the provisions of section 35-190 relating to lapsing  
3 of appropriations. The department shall adopt rules or policies for grants  
4 of less than five thousand dollars that encourage as much competition as  
5 practicable.

6 B. The director or the director's designee may solicit and receive  
7 donations, including in-kind donations, from the public for veterans. The  
8 director shall deposit, pursuant to sections 35-146 and 35-147, the monetary  
9 donations in the veterans' donations fund. Monies in the fund are subject to  
10 state auditing procedures. Except for monies deposited pursuant to sections  
11 28-2431 and 28-2447, the donations may be used for the benefit of the  
12 veterans within this state as grants, subject to chapter 24 of this title, if  
13 applicable.

14 C. The director shall establish a separate subaccount in the veterans'  
15 donations fund for the deposit of monies received pursuant to section  
16 28-2431, subsection C. The monies in the subaccount shall be used for the  
17 construction and maintenance of the enduring freedom memorial authorized  
18 pursuant to section 41-1363 for placement in Wesley Bolin Plaza.

19 D. The director shall establish a separate subaccount in the veterans'

22 benefit of women veterans in this state, including providing shelter to
