CHAPTER 184

SENATE BILL 1152

AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 9, CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE 8, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 9-499.17; RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 9, chapter 4, article 8, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
3 amended by adding section 9-499.17, to read:

4 9-499.17. Transportation safety zones; passenger convenience
5 areas; definitions

6 A. A CITY OR TOWN MAY ADOPT A RESOLUTION OR ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING
7 PASSENGER CONVENIENCE AREAS AND VEHICLE-FOR-HIRE LANES WITHIN A
8 TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE. THE GOVERNING BODY OF A CITY OR TOWN MAY ADOPT
9 RESOLUTIONS OR ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING HOURS OF OPERATION AND PROCEDURES FOR
10 THE USE OF PASSENGER CONVENIENCE AREAS AND VEHICLE-FOR-HIRE LANES.

11 B. THE GOVERNING BODY OF A CITY OR TOWN MAY ESTABLISH, BY RESOLUTION
12 OR ORDINANCE, A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE, IF THE GOVERNING BODY FINDS THAT
13 A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE IS NECESSARY TO PRESERVE THE PUBLIC HEALTH,
14 SAFETY AND GENERAL WELFARE. A RESOLUTION OR ORDINANCE ADOPTED PURSUANT TO
15 THIS SUBSECTION MUST INCLUDE A MAP ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONE
16 AND TRAFFIC SAFETY DATA USED TO JUSTIFY THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ZONE. EACH
17 TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE MUST BE NO GREATER THAN THREE SQUARE MILES, AND A
18 CITY OR TOWN MAY NOT CREATE MORE THAN TWO TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONES WITHIN
19 ITS CORPORATE BOUNDARIES. A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE MAY NOT INCLUDE ANY
20 PORTION OF A STATE HIGHWAY OR STATE ROUTE.

21 C. ON ESTABLISHMENT OF A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE, THE CITY OR TOWN
22 MAY PLACE AND MAINTAIN PERMANENTLY AFFIXED SIGNS LOCATED IN A VISIBLE MANNER
23 AT THE PUBLIC VEHICULAR ACCESS POINTS LEADING INTO THE ZONE FOR THE PURPOSE
24 OF DELINEATING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONE.

25 D. A CITY OR TOWN WITH A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE MAY REQUIRE A
26 VEHICLE THAT IS SELF-PROPELLED ENTIRELY OR PARTIALLY BY PEDALS OPERATED BY
27 THE PASSENGERS TO OPERATE PURSUANT TO PUBLIC SAFETY AND TRAFFIC ORDINANCES.

28 E. EXCEPT IN THE EVENT OF A PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY, A CITY OR TOWN
29 MAY NOT PRESCRIBE THE ORDER IN WHICH A VEHICLE MAY LOAD OR UNLOAD PASSENGERS
30 IN A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE. NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE
31 CONSTRUED TO INTERFERE OR RESTRICT THE ABILITY OF A CITY OR TOWN TO REGULATE
32 THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC OR ENFORCE ANY STATE LAW.

33 F. THIS SECTION DOES NOT IMPOSE OR AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL REGULATION,
34 PERMITTING OR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS BEYOND THOSE REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION
35 AND TITLE 41, CHAPTER 15.

36 G. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

37 1. "PASSENGER CART" MEANS ANY MOTORIZED VEHICLE, EXCEPT A BUS, THAT IS
38 USED TO TRANSPORT PASSENGERS ON A PUBLIC ROADWAY IN EXCHANGE FOR ANY FORM OF
39 PAYMENT OR GRATUITY AND THAT IS NOT LICENSED AS A LIVERY VEHICLE, TAXI OR
40 LIMOUSINE PURSUANT TO TITLE 41, CHAPTER 15.

1 2. "PASSENGER CONVENIENCE AREA" MEANS AN AREA DESIGNATED BY A CITY OR
2 TOWN WHERE TAXIS, PASSENGER CARTS, LIVERY VEHICLES OR LIMOUSINES MAY ENTER
3 FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE LOADING AND UNLOADING OF PASSENGERS. DRIVERS SHALL
4 NOT LEAVE VEHICLES UNATTENDED IN A PASSENGER CONVENIENCE AREA.

5 3. "VEHICLE-FOR-HIRE LANE" MEANS A DESIGNATED TRAFFIC LANE FOR USE
6 EXCLUSIVELY BY VEHICLES PICKING UP OR DROPPING OFF PASSENGERS IN EXCHANGE FOR
7 ANY FORM OF PAYMENT, INCLUDING A FEE, FARE, DONATION OR GRATUITY.
