## **HOUSE BILL 2274**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 41-191.02, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE  
ATTORNEY GENERAL.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 41-191.02, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 41-191.02. Antitrust enforcement revolving fund; receipts and  
5 disbursements; exemption; report; data collection

6 A. ~~There is created an~~ THE antitrust enforcement revolving fund IS  
7 ESTABLISHED to be administered by the attorney general under the conditions  
8 and for the purposes provided in this section. Monies in the fund are  
9 subject to legislative appropriation. Monies in the fund shall be exempt  
10 from the lapsing provisions of section 35-190.

11 B. On or before the fifteenth day of January, April, July and October,  
12 the attorney general shall cause to be filed with the governor, with copies  
13 to the director of the department of administration, the president of the  
14 senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, a full and complete  
15 account of the receipts and disbursements from the fund in the previous  
16 calendar quarter.

17 C. Monies in the fund shall be used by the attorney general for costs  
18 and expenses of antitrust enforcement undertaken by his office and may be  
19 expended for such items as filing fees, court costs, travel, depositions,  
20 transcripts, reproduction costs, expert witness fees, investigations, and  
21 like costs and expenses. Except for the attorney fees due upon the initial  
22 recovery of monies as set out in section 41-191.01, in no event shall any of  
23 the monies in the fund be used to compensate or employ attorneys or  
24 counselors at law.

25 D. The attorney general shall collect, compile and save data, in a  
26 format accessible to the Arizona commerce authority or any member of the  
27 legislature, showing the average rack fuel prices for the Phoenix and Tucson  
28 petroleum pipeline terminals on a weekly basis ~~and the average dealer tank~~  
29 ~~wagon prices for Phoenix and Tucson on a weekly basis.~~ The attorney general  
30 may acquire the data by survey or may purchase the data. If the attorney  
31 general purchases the data, the data shall be acquired at the lowest  
32 available competitive price. The attorney general shall make the data  
33 available to the ~~department of~~ ARIZONA commerce AUTHORITY or any member of  
34 the legislature without charge.
