HOUSE BILL 2239

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 39-127, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO PUBLIC RECORDS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 39-127, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 39-127. Free copies of police reports and transcripts for crime
5 victims; definition

6 A. A victim of a criminal offense that is a part I crime under the
7 statewide uniform crime reporting program, THE VICTIM'S ATTORNEY ON BEHALF OF
8 THE VICTIM or an immediate family member of the victim if the victim is
9 killed or incapacitated has the right to receive one copy of the police
10 report from the investigating law enforcement agency at no charge and, on
11 request of the victim, the court or the clerk of the court shall provide, at
12 no charge, the minute entry or portion of the record of any proceeding in the
13 case that arises out of the offense committed against the victim and that is
14 reasonably necessary for the purpose of pursuing a claimed victim's right.
15 For the purposes of this subsection, "criminal offense", "immediate family"
16 and "victim" have the same meanings prescribed in section 13-4401.

17 B. A victim of a delinquent act that is a part I crime under the
18 statewide uniform crime reporting program, THE VICTIM'S ATTORNEY ON BEHALF OF
19 THE VICTIM or an immediate family member of the victim if the victim is
20 killed or incapacitated has the right to receive one copy of the police
21 report from the investigating law enforcement agency at no charge and, on
22 request of the victim, the court or the clerk of the court shall provide, at
23 no charge, the minute entry or portion of the record of any proceeding in the
24 case that arises out of the offense committed against the victim and that is
25 reasonably necessary for the purpose of pursuing a claimed victim's right.
26 For the purposes of this subsection, "delinquent act", "immediate family" and
27 "victim" have the same meanings prescribed in section 8-382.

28 C. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "ATTORNEY" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO
29 IS A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING OF THE BAR OF THE HIGHEST COURT OF ANY STATE,
30 POSSESSION, TERRITORY, COMMONWEALTH OR DISTRICT OF THE UNITED STATES AND WHO
31 IS NOT UNDER ANY ORDER OF ANY COURT SUSPENDING, ENJOINING, RESTRAINING,
32 DISBARRING OR OTHERWISE RESTRICTING THE PERSON IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW.
