**CHAPTER 100**  
**HOUSE BILL 2535**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 37-620, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO CONCURRENT  
CRIMINAL JURISDICTION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 37-620, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 37-620. Vesting of concurrent criminal jurisdiction in the  
5 United States over certain lands and areas

6 A. Concurrent criminal jurisdiction over any lands in ~~the~~ THIS  
7 state heretofore reserved from public domain or acquired by the United  
8 States as identified in subsection D OF THIS SECTION, and any additions  
9 made to such lands, is hereby vested in the United States ~~upon~~ ON  
10 completion of the conditions set forth in subsection B OF THIS SECTION,  
11 except that the jurisdiction of ~~the~~ THIS state over such lands shall  
12 continue.

13 B. Concurrent criminal jurisdiction ~~shall vest~~ VESTS as to the  
14 lands in each area identified in subsection D OF THIS SECTION when the  
15 United States submits to the governor of ~~the~~ THIS state a formal written  
16 request for concurrent criminal jurisdiction accompanied by a satisfactory  
17 legal description and plat of ~~such~~ THE area, and ~~upon~~ ON approval by the  
18 governor granting concurrent jurisdiction ~~such~~ THE legal description and  
19 plat shall be filed by the governor with the county recorder of each  
20 county in which the land is situated. ~~The~~ THIS state may withdraw  
21 jurisdiction over any land or area three years after written notification  
22 by the governor to the secretary of the interior.

23 C. The concurrent criminal jurisdiction hereby vested ~~shall~~  
24 ~~continue~~ CONTINUES only as long as the United States continues to own or  
25 control the lands within ~~such~~ THOSE areas. In the case of any lands  
26 included within the boundaries of the areas set forth in subsection D OF  
27 THIS SECTION that are not owned or controlled by the United States, the  
28 jurisdiction ~~shall~~ DOES not change by operation of this section.

29 D. The lands subject to this section are all those lands that are  
30 owned or controlled by the United States and that are now or hereafter  
31 included within the exterior boundaries of:

- 32 1. The national park service lands consisting of:
- 33 (a) Canyon de Chelly national monument.
  - 34 (b) Casa Grande Ruins national monument.
  - 35 (c) Chiricahua national monument.
  - 36 (d) Coronado national memorial.
  - 37 (e) Fort Bowie national historic site.
  - 38 (f) Glen Canyon national recreation area.
  - 39 (g) Grand Canyon national park.
  - 40 (h) Hohokam Pima national monument.
  - 41 (i) Hubbell Trading Post national historic site.
  - 42 (j) Lake Mead national recreation area.
  - 43 (k) Montezuma Castle national monument.
  - 44 (l) Navajo national monument.
  - 45 (m) Organ Pipe Cactus national monument.

- 1 (n) Petrified Forest national park.
- 2 (o) Pipe Spring national monument.
- 3 (p) Saguaro national monument.
- 4 (q) Sunset Crater national monument.
- 5 (r) Tonto national monument.
- 6 (s) Tumacacori national monument.
- 7 (t) Tuzigoot national monument.
- 8 (u) Walnut Canyon national monument.
- 9 (v) Wupatki national monument.

10 2. Those lands administered by the bureau of reclamation or its  
11 successor agency of the UNITED STATES department of the interior  
12 consisting of:

- 13 (a) Davis dam.
- 14 (b) Glen Canyon dam.
- 15 (c) Hoover dam.
- 16 (d) Imperial dam.
- 17 (e) Laguna dam.
- 18 (f) Parker dam.

19 3. Lands administered by the UNITED STATES department of defense or  
20 its successor land management agency consisting of the Barry M. Goldwater  
21 range. This paragraph is effective only after a memorandum of  
22 understanding has been completed with the sheriff of a county that has  
23 territory within the Barry M. Goldwater range to address lead  
24 investigative agency responsibilities on specific crimes and other  
25 coordinating matters, ~~and applies through December 1, 2017.~~ For the  
26 purposes of this paragraph, THE Barry M. Goldwater range is defined by the  
27 military lands withdrawal act of 1999 (~~Public Law P.L. 106-65~~) and federal  
28 register ~~volume 66, number 231, Friday, November 30, 2001.~~
