Re: Senate Bill 1122 (personal property transfer; limitations prohibited)

Dear Secretary Reagan:

Today I signed SB1122, which helps protect the Second Amendment. SB1122 ensures a private citizen's right to personally transfer or sell private property, including a firearm, without requiring the owner to search any federal or state databases, or involve a third party.

This bill is consistent with our state preemption laws and my signing of last year's HB2224 (private firearm transactions; prohibited encumbrances). In Arizona, knowingly selling or transferring a deadly weapon to a prohibited possessor is a class 6 felony (A.R.S. § 13-3102).

I look forward to continuing to work with the legislature to protect our Second Amendment rights.

AMENDING TITLE 44, CHAPTER 9, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING ARTICLE
26; RELATING TO TRADE PRACTICES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 44, chapter 9, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
3 amended by adding article 26, to read:

4 ARTICLE 26. TRANSFER OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

5 44-1382. Transfer of personal property; city, town or county

6 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, THIS STATE AND A CITY, TOWN OR COUNTY
7 SHALL NOT REQUIRE AS A CONDITION OF A PRIVATE SALE, GIFT, DONATION OR
8 OTHER TRANSFER OF PERSONAL PROPERTY THAT THE OWNER OF THE PERSONAL
9 PROPERTY SEARCH OR FACILITATE THE SEARCH OF ANY FEDERAL OR STATE DATABASES
10 AND SHALL NOT REQUIRE THAT A THIRD PARTY BE INVOLVED.
