CHAPTER 21
SENATE BILL 1072

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 8-463, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE
DEPARTMENT OF CHILD SAFETY.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 8-463, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 8-463. Department of child safety employees; employees of
5 contractors; fingerprint requirement

6 A. Each employee of the department who has contact with children or
7 who is employed in an information technology position shall have a valid
8 fingerprint clearance card issued pursuant to section 41-1758.07 or
9 provide to the department documentation of the person's application for a
10 fingerprint clearance card. The employee shall certify on forms that are
11 provided by the department and that are notarized that the employee is not
12 awaiting trial on or has never been convicted of or admitted in open court
13 or pursuant to a plea agreement to committing any of the criminal offenses
14 listed in section 41-1758.07, subsections B and C in this state or similar
15 offenses in another state or jurisdiction.

16 B. The department may not disclose information obtained pursuant to
17 this section except to members of the department's staff solely for
18 employment purposes.

19 C. An employee of a contractor or subcontractor who is employed in
20 an information technology position and who will have access to department
21 information ~~in any state data system~~ AS PART OF THE EMPLOYEE'S JOB DUTIES
22 must meet the requirements of subsection A of this section. An employee
23 of a contractor or subcontractor in an information technology position may
24 not have access to department information until the employee meets the
25 requirements of subsection A of this section. If such an employee fails
26 to obtain a fingerprint clearance card, the employee shall immediately be
27 denied access to any department information technology system. The
28 contractor or subcontractor is responsible for the costs of obtaining the
29 employee's fingerprint clearance card and may charge these costs to the
30 fingerprinted employee. The department may allow all or part of the costs
31 to obtain a fingerprint clearance card to be included as an allowable cost
32 in a contract.
