CHAPTER 230
HOUSE BILL 2125

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE TOWING SAFETY TASK FORCE.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Towing safety task force; membership; duties;
3 report; delayed repeal

4 A. The towing safety task force is established consisting of the
5 following members:

6 1. Two members of the house of representatives who are appointed by
7 the speaker of the house of representatives and who are members of
8 different political parties. The speaker of the house of representatives
9 shall designate one of these members to serve as chairperson of the task
10 force.

11 2. Two members of the senate who are appointed by the president of
12 the senate and who are members of different political parties. The
13 president of the senate shall designate one of these members to serve as
14 vice chairperson of the task force.

15 3. The director of the department of public safety or the
16 director's designee.

17 4. Two members who represent the towing industry, one of whom is
18 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one of whom
19 is appointed by the president of the senate.

20 5. One member who represents a local law enforcement agency who is
21 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

22 6. One at-large member who is appointed by the president of the
23 senate.

24 B. The task force shall:

25 1. Review the safety efficacy of existing towing laws.

26 2. Receive data, reports and testimony regarding towing and
27 roadside safety.

28 3. Recommend driver education measures to improve driver awareness
29 of existing laws and promote driving habits that emphasize roadside
30 safety.

31 4. Recommend policy proposals to improve towing safety in this
32 state.

33 5. Engage in any other related duties as determined by the task
34 force members.

35 6. Submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the
36 governor, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
37 representatives on or before December 31, 2018 and shall provide a copy of
38 this report to the secretary of state.

39 C. The task force may hold hearings, conduct fact-finding tours and
40 take testimony from witnesses who may assist the task force in fulfilling
41 its responsibilities. All hearings of the task force shall be open to the
42 public.

43 D. The legislature shall provide staff and support services to the
44 task force.

45 E. Task force members are not eligible to receive compensation.

46 F. This section is repealed from and after September 30, 2019.
