CHAPTER 115
SENATE BILL 1048

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 15-1805.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO
COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2 Section 1. Section 15-1805.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended
3 to read:
4 15-1805.01. Admissions; enrollments; community colleges
5 A. Admissions to the community colleges in this state may be
6 granted to any person who meets at least one of the following criteria:
7 1. Is a graduate of a high school that is accredited by a regional
8 accrediting association as defined by the United States office of
9 education or approved by a state board of education or other appropriate
10 state educational agency.
11 2. Has a high school certificate of equivalency.
12 3. Is at least eighteen years of age and demonstrates evidence of
13 potential success in the community college.
14 4. Is a transfer student in good standing from another college or
15 university.
16 B. Each community college district shall adopt policies regarding
17 the admission of students who are under eighteen years of age that
18 include, at a minimum, student completion of course prerequisites and the
19 following requirements:
20 1. ~~Admission to the~~ A community ~~colleges~~ COLLEGE in this state
21 shall ~~be granted~~ GRANT ADMISSION to any student who is under eighteen
22 years of age and who achieves at least one of the following:
23 (a) A composite score of ~~93~~ 720 or more on the ~~preliminary~~
24 ~~scholastic aptitude test~~ PSAT.
25 (b) A composite score of ~~930~~ 720 or more on the ~~scholastic aptitude~~
26 ~~test~~ SAT.
27 (c) A composite score of ~~twenty-two~~ TWELVE or more on the ~~American~~
28 ~~college test~~ ACT.
29 (d) A passing score on the relevant portions of the statewide
30 assessment.
31 (e) The completion of a college placement ~~test~~ METHOD designated by
32 the community college district that indicates the student is at the
33 appropriate college level for the course.
34 (f) Is a graduate of a private or public high school or has a high
35 school certificate of equivalency.
36 2. A community college may limit the number of semester hours in
37 which the student may enroll to not more than six credit hours.
38 C. Homeschooled students are exempt from subsection B of this
39 section.

1 D. Students who enroll in vocational courses may be admitted on an
2 individual basis with the approval of college officials if the student
3 meets the established requirements of the courses for which the student
4 enrolls and the college officials determine that the student's admission
5 is in the best interest of the student.

6 Sec. 2. Emergency

7 This act is an emergency measure that is necessary to preserve the
8 public peace, health or safety and is operative immediately as provided by
9 law.
