HOUSE BILL 2750

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTIONS 15-1444 AND 15-1642, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; REPEALING SECTION 15-1647, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING SECTION 15-1655, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS ADDED BY LAWS 2017, CHAPTER 310, SECTION 5; REPEALING SECTION 15-1655, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2018, CHAPTER 281, SECTION 3; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-1670 AND 35-146, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO BUDGET RECONCILIATION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 15-1444, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 15-1444. General powers and duties of district governing
5 boards

6 A. Except as otherwise provided, the district board shall:

7 1. Maintain each community college for a period of not less than
8 eight months in each year and, if the funds of the district are
9 sufficient, maintain each community college for a longer period.

10 2. Adopt policies in a public forum to offer programs that meet the
11 educational needs of the population served by the community college.

12 3. Enforce the courses of study prescribed by the district board.

13 4. Visit each community college under its jurisdiction and examine
14 carefully into its management, conditions and needs.

15 5. Exclude from each community college all books, publications or
16 papers of a sectarian, partisan or denominational character intended for
17 use as textbooks.

18 6. Appoint and employ a chancellor or chancellors,
19 vice-chancellors, a president or presidents, vice presidents, deans,
20 professors, instructors, lecturers, fellows and such other officers and
21 employees it deems necessary. The district board may enter into
22 employment contracts with chancellors, vice-chancellors and presidents for
23 a duration of more than one year but not more than five years.

24 7. Determine the salaries of persons it appoints and employs. A
25 DISTRICT MAY NOT COMPENSATE AN EMPLOYEE FOR WORK PERFORMED ON BEHALF OF AN
26 ELECTED EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION AND MAY NOT PROVIDE MORE
27 FAVORABLE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT TO ANY EMPLOYEE BECAUSE THAT
28 INDIVIDUAL BELONGS TO AN ELECTED EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION.

29 8. Remove any officer or employee if in its judgment the interests
30 of education in this state require the removal.

31 9. Award degrees, certificates and diplomas on the completion of
32 courses and curricula as it deems appropriate.

33 10. Appoint or employ, if it deems necessary, police officers who
34 shall have the authority and power of peace officers. The police officers
35 who have received a certificate from the Arizona peace officer standards
36 and training board are eligible for membership in and benefits under
37 either title 38, chapter 5, article 2 or the public safety personnel
38 retirement system under title 38, chapter 5, article 4.

39 11. Determine the location within the district of a community
40 college and purchase, receive, hold, make and take leases of, sell and
41 convey real or personal property for the benefit of the community colleges
42 under its jurisdiction.

43 12. Obtain insurance or be self-insured, or a combination of
44 insurance and self-insurance, against loss, to the extent it is determined

1 necessary on community college buildings of the district. The local
2 district shall have an insurable interest in the buildings.

3 B. The district board may:

4 1. Administer trusts declared or created for the district and
5 receive by gift or devise and hold in trust or otherwise property
6 wheresoever located, and if not otherwise provided, dispose of the
7 property for the benefit of the district.

8 2. Lease real property, as lessor or as lessee. If a district is
9 the lessee, the lease may contain an option to purchase the property. The
10 district board may adopt policies as are deemed necessary and may delegate
11 in writing to the chancellor or president of the district, or their
12 designees, all or any part of its authority to lease property under this
13 paragraph. Any delegation by the district board pursuant to this
14 paragraph may be rescinded in whole or in part at any time by the district
15 board.

16 3. Sue and be sued.

17 4. Contract. The district board may adopt such policies as are
18 deemed necessary and may delegate in writing to the chancellor or
19 president of the district, or their designees, all or any part of its
20 authority to contract under this paragraph. Any delegation of authority
21 under this paragraph may be rescinded by the district board at any time in
22 whole or in part.

23 5. Construct, remodel and repair buildings.

24 6. In conjunction with other districts, establish policies for
25 procurement of goods and services.

26 7. Provide a plan or plans for employee benefits, which may include
27 optional retirement programs pursuant to section 15-1451, subsection A,
28 which allow for participation in a cafeteria plan that meets the
29 requirements of the United States internal revenue code of 1986.

30 8. Accept grants or donations of monies from the United States or
31 any of its agencies, departments or officers, this state, political
32 subdivisions of this state, tribal governments, school districts, special
33 taxing districts, persons, corporations, foundations or associations. The
34 district board shall deposit the monies into a specific fund or account
35 and shall administer the monies in accordance with the purpose of the
36 grant or donation with specific policies or restrictions as described or
37 stipulated in the grant or donation. In the case of personal property
38 granted or donated to or for the benefit of a community college district,
39 the district board shall immediately transfer possession and ownership of
40 the property to the designated district. Monies received pursuant to this
41 paragraph are not considered local revenues for the purposes of article
42 IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona.

43 9. Enter into intergovernmental agreements or contracts pursuant to
44 section 11-952.01 for participation in programs offered by public agency
45 pools or separately contract with a trustee or board of trustees that

1 provides a common self-insurance program with pooled funds and risks
2 pursuant to section 15-382, subsection B, paragraph 2. The district board
3 is not required to engage in competitive procurement in order to make the
4 decision to participate in these programs.

5 10. Name a building or a group of buildings that is located on a
6 community college campus on behalf of a person or entity that has made a
7 significant contribution of monies or other property to the community
8 college or the community college district.

9 11. Enter into research and development agreements, royalty
10 agreements, development agreements, licensing agreements and
11 profit-sharing agreements concerning the research, development,
12 production, storing or marketing of new products developed or to be
13 developed through community college district research. Monies received
14 pursuant to this paragraph are not considered local revenues for the
15 purposes of article IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona.

16 12. Enter into an intergovernmental agreement pursuant to section
17 15-1747 to participate in a reciprocity agreement subject to the terms of
18 the reciprocity agreement.

19 13. Engage in entrepreneurial and commercial activities. Monies
20 received pursuant to this paragraph are not considered local revenues for
21 the purposes of article IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona.

22 14. Collect auxiliary fees, including cafeteria fees, food service
23 fees, bookstore fees and dormitory fees. Monies received pursuant to this
24 paragraph are not considered local revenues for the purposes of article
25 IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona.

26 15. Provide goods and services pursuant to a contract with a
27 political subdivision of this state or with a tribal government. Monies
28 received pursuant to this paragraph are not considered local revenues for
29 the purposes of article IX, section 21, Constitution of Arizona.

30 C. If a district acquires real or personal property, whether by
31 purchase, exchange, condemnation, gift or otherwise, the district shall
32 pay to the county treasurer any taxes on the property that were unpaid as
33 of the date of acquisition, including penalties and interest. The lien
34 for unpaid delinquent taxes, penalties and interest on property acquired
35 by the district:

36 1. Is not abated, extinguished, discharged or merged in the title
37 to the property.

38 2. Is enforceable in the same manner as other delinquent tax liens.

39 D. In a district whose boundaries encompass a vehicle emissions
40 control area as defined in section 49-541, the district board shall
41 require all out-of-county and out-of-state students to sign an affidavit
42 at the time of course registration that the student's vehicle meets the
43 requirements of section 49-542. The district board on property under its
44 jurisdiction within a vehicle emissions control area shall prohibit the
45 parking of those vehicles that fail to comply with section 49-542.

1 E. A community college district and a career technical education
2 district governing board may enter into agreements for the provision of
3 administrative, operational and educational services and facilities.

4 F. Each district may establish a program for the exchange of
5 students between the community colleges under its jurisdiction and
6 colleges and universities located in Sonora, Mexico. The program may
7 provide for in-state tuition for Sonora students at the community colleges
8 under the jurisdiction of the district in exchange for similar tuition
9 provisions for Arizona students enrolled or seeking enrollment in Sonora
10 colleges and universities. The community colleges may work in conjunction
11 with the Arizona-Mexico commission in the governor's office to coordinate
12 recruitment and admissions activities to provide for in-state tuition for
13 up to fifty Sonora students at the community colleges under the
14 jurisdiction of the district in exchange for similar tuition provisions
15 for up to fifty total Arizona students enrolled or seeking enrollment in
16 Sonora colleges and universities.

17 G. Each district shall facilitate transfer articulation
18 coordination pursuant to section 15-1824.

19 Sec. 2. Section 15-1642, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
20 read:

21 15-1642. Financial aid trust fund; aid to students with
22 verifiable financial need; endowment

23 A. The Arizona board of regents may establish a financial aid trust
24 fund for the purposes of providing immediate aid to students with
25 verifiable financial need, including students who are underrepresented in
26 the population of university students or who by virtue of their special
27 circumstances present unique needs for financial aid, and creating an
28 endowment for future financial aid. Subject to the ~~limitations~~ LIMITS
29 provided in subsection B, paragraph 3 OF THIS SECTION, the board may
30 assess a surcharge ~~upon~~ ON registration fees paid by students for deposit
31 in the fund. THE FUND SHALL ALSO CONSIST OF MONIES DEPOSITED PURSUANT TO
32 SECTION 15-1670, SUBSECTION F.

33 B. The board shall adopt rules to govern the financial aid trust
34 fund, including the following:

35 1. Twenty-five ~~per cent~~ PERCENT of the monies received each year
36 shall be placed in the trust fund as a permanent endowment. The remaining
37 monies received shall be used for immediate aid for students with
38 verifiable financial need. At least fifty ~~per cent~~ PERCENT of the
39 immediate aid monies shall be used for grant aid.

40 2. The immediate aid monies shall be distributed to the
41 universities on a pro rata basis based on relative student contributions
42 to the fund.

43 3. The surcharge on student registration shall not exceed one ~~per~~
44 ~~cent~~ PERCENT of the registration fee for students taking more than six
45 credit surcharge hours. The surcharge hours for students taking fewer

1 than seven credit hours shall equal one-half the surcharge assessed
2 students taking more than six credit hours.

3 C. Each dollar raised pursuant to the surcharge on student
4 registration shall be matched by ~~two dollars~~ \$2 appropriated by the
5 legislature.

6 D. The board shall report every three years to the legislature on
7 the status of the financial aid trust fund. The report shall include the
8 use to which the monies have been put and the impact of such use.

9 E. Fund monies shall only be used in university assistance programs
10 approved by the board and such monies shall be in addition to, and not in
11 replacement of, existing state or institutional financial aid monies.
12 Assistance may be provided to full-time or part-time students. Monies
13 appropriated by this state shall not be used to provide assistance to
14 students who are not residents of this state.

16 Section 15-1647, Arizona Revised Statutes, is repealed.

17 Sec. 4. Section 15-1655, Arizona Revised Statutes, as added by Laws
18 2017, chapter 310, section 5, is amended to read:

19 15-1655. Arizona teachers academy; tuition and fees
20 scholarships; fund; annual report; definitions

21 A. ~~For the 2017-2018 academic year, universities under the~~
22 ~~jurisdiction of the Arizona board of regents~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY
23 INSTITUTIONS shall implement an Arizona ~~teacher~~ TEACHERS academy to
24 incentivize ~~Arizona resident~~ students to enter the teaching profession and
25 to commit to teach in Arizona public schools. The Arizona board of
26 regents, in consultation with ~~universities under the jurisdiction of the~~
27 ~~board~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTIONS, shall develop AND IMPLEMENT
28 CENTRALIZED ADMINISTRATIVE PROCESSES FOR THE ACADEMY, INCLUDING:

29 ~~1. Metrics to assess the efficacy of the academy.~~

30 ~~2.~~ 1. A marketing and promotion plan to recruit students for the
31 academy.

32 2. DATA COLLECTION AND REPORTING.

33 3. TRACKING POSTGRADUATION SERVICE REQUIREMENTS.

34 4. COORDINATING INDUCTION SERVICES.

35 5. DISTRIBUTING MONIES IN THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY FUND BETWEEN
36 ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTIONS.

37 6. COLLECTING REIMBURSEMENT FROM INDIVIDUALS WHO FAIL TO MEET
38 SERVICE OBLIGATIONS.

39 B. The Arizona ~~teacher~~ TEACHERS academy may include new or existing
40 teacher preparation program pathways that are student-focused and that
41 employ proven, research-based models of best practices already being
42 implemented. Each ~~university~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION may
43 develop a portfolio of teacher preparation programs to offer as part of
44 the academy. Programs offered as part of the academy shall include
45 accelerated models for:

1 1. High-demand teacher specializations, including SPECIAL
2 EDUCATION, science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

3 2. CRITICAL NEED AREAS, INCLUDING LOW-INCOME PUBLIC SCHOOLS, PUBLIC
4 SCHOOLS LOCATED ON INDIAN RESERVATIONS AND RURAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

5 ~~2.~~ 3. Individuals seeking postbaccalaureate coursework that
6 results in professional certification.

7 C. Each ~~university~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION shall develop
8 formalized partnerships with public schools in this state to build
9 commitments for teacher employment on completion of the Arizona ~~teacher~~
10 TEACHERS academy. The targeted deployment of teachers who have completed
11 the academy shall be based on the needs of each school system and the
12 community that is being served as well as the individual skills of each
13 teacher.

14 D. Each ~~university~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION shall provide
15 TO each full-time student WHO IS enrolled in the Arizona ~~teacher~~ TEACHERS
16 academy an annual ~~waiver~~ SCHOLARSHIP OF "\$10,000 PER YEAR FOR A MAXIMUM OF
17 TWO ACADEMIC YEARS OR FOUR SEMESTERS FOR GRADUATE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS,
18 \$5,000 PER YEAR FOR A MAXIMUM OF FOUR ACADEMIC YEARS OR EIGHT SEMESTERS
19 FOR UNDERGRADUATE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS, \$3,000 PER YEAR FOR A MAXIMUM OF
20 TWO ACADEMIC YEARS OR FOUR SEMESTERS FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS for
21 ~~att~~ tuition and fees associated with the student's program of study AND
22 \$2,500 ONETIME FOR TEACHERS SEEKING NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION, AFTER
23 ALL OTHER FINANCIAL GIFTS, AID OR GRANTS RECEIVED BY THAT STUDENT OR
24 TEACHER. SCHOLARSHIPS UNDER THIS SUBSECTION ARE subject to ALL OF the
25 following:

26 1. If the student does not successfully complete the academic year
27 in good academic standing, the student shall reimburse the ~~university~~
28 ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS for the total amount of the ~~waiver~~ SCHOLARSHIP
29 for tuition and fees the student received for that year.

30 2. For each academic year that the student successfully completes
31 and for which the student receives a ~~waiver~~ SCHOLARSHIP for all tuition
32 and fees, the student must agree to teach for one full school year in a
33 public school in this state. FOR STUDENTS TEACHING AND RECEIVING THE
34 SCHOLARSHIP CONCURRENTLY, THE COMMITMENT PERIOD BEGINS AFTER GRADUATION
35 FROM THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY. FOR TEACHERS SEEKING A NATIONAL BOARD
36 CERTIFICATION, THE TEACHING COMMITMENT IS ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR AFTER
37 COMPLETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION PROGRAM.

38 3. IF THE SCHOLARSHIP DOES NOT COVER REMAINING TUITION AND FEE
39 COSTS AFTER OTHER AID RECEIVED, THE ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION MAY
40 NOT CHARGE STUDENTS THE REMAINING DIFFERENCE. IF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT
41 EXCEEDS TUITION AND FEE COSTS AT AN ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION,
42 THE INSTITUTION MAY USE THE REMAINING AMOUNT TO SUPPORT ARIZONA TEACHERS
43 ACADEMY COSTS.

44 ~~3.~~ 4. If the student does not fulfill the student's ~~agreement~~
45 OBLIGATION to teach in a public school, the student must reimburse the

1 ~~university~~ ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS for the proportional amount of the
2 ~~waiver~~ SCHOLARSHIP for tuition and fees that the student received that
3 corresponds to the number of school years the student agreed to teach but
4 did not teach in a public school in this state.

5 ~~4.~~ 5. If the student is physically or mentally unable to fulfill
6 the requirements of the ARIZONA TEACHERS academy, the ~~university~~ ARIZONA
7 BOARD OF REGENTS shall ~~assess~~ ESTABLISH A PROCESS FOR ASSESSING the
8 student's ability to repay the financial assistance received and shall
9 make a determination on any terms of repayment.

10 6. THE ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS SHALL ESTABLISH A PROCESS FOR
11 DEFERRING SERVICE OR REPAYMENT BASED ON FACTORS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.

12 E. STUDENTS ENROLLED IN A NONEDUCATION PROGRAM IN THE ARIZONA
13 TEACHERS ACADEMY MUST COMPLETE ONE OR MORE TEACHER PREPARATION COURSES TO
14 ENSURE THE LIKELIHOOD THAT THE STUDENT WILL TRANSITION INTO A
15 POSTBACCALAUREATE PROGRAM TO RECEIVE A TEACHING CERTIFICATION FOLLOWING
16 GRADUATION.

17 F. THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY FUND IS ESTABLISHED CONSISTING OF
18 LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS MADE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADMINISTERING THE
19 ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY. MONIES IN THE FUND ARE CONTINUOUSLY
20 APPROPRIATED AND ARE EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 35-190 RELATING
21 TO THE LAPSING OF APPROPRIATIONS. THE ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS SHALL
22 ADMINISTER THE FUND AND SHALL ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR DISTRIBUTING MONIES
23 IN THE FUND TO ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTIONS EACH FISCAL YEAR TO
24 FUND THE COSTS OF THE ACADEMY. MONIES IN THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR:

25 1. REIMBURSING ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIPS THAT COVER THE
26 BALANCE OF TUITION AND FEES FOR UNDERGRADUATE, GRADUATE AND
27 POSTBACCALAUREATE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY AFTER
28 ALL OTHER GIFTS AND AID RECEIVED.

29 2. SUPPORT FOR TEACHERS WHO ARE CURRENTLY EMPLOYED IN A PUBLIC
30 SCHOOL IN THIS STATE AND WHO ARE SEEKING A NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION.

31 3. INDUCTION SERVICES FOR ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY GRADUATES.

32 4. IMPLEMENTING A MARKETING AND PROMOTION PLAN TO RECRUIT AND
33 RETAIN STUDENTS IN THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY AND ADMINISTERING THE
34 ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY. ANNUAL EXPENDITURES FOR MARKETING, PROMOTING
35 AND ADMINISTRATING THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY MAY NOT EXCEED THREE
36 PERCENT OF THE MONIES IN THE FUND EACH FISCAL YEAR.

37 G. MONIES REMAINING IN THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY FUND AT THE END
38 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR MAY BE USED BY ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTIONS FOR
39 ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY COSTS IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR.

40 H. ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE STATE GENERAL
41 FUND APPROPRIATION FOR THE ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL
42 YEAR SHALL BE REDUCED BY THE AMOUNT OF MONIES REMAINING IN THE ARIZONA
43 TEACHERS ACADEMY FUND AT THE END OF THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR.

44 I. ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1, 2020 AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE ARIZONA
45 BOARD OF REGENTS SHALL REPORT TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMITTEE

1 AND THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF STRATEGIC PLANNING AND BUDGETING ON ALL OF
2 THE FOLLOWING:

3 1. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE ARIZONA TEACHERS
4 ACADEMY BY ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION IN THE CURRENT ACADEMIC
5 YEAR.

6 2. THE NUMBER OF ARIZONA TEACHERS ACADEMY GRADUATES RECEIVING
7 INDUCTION SERVICES IN THE CURRENT ACADEMIC YEAR.

8 3. THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF MONIES COMMITTED FROM THE ARIZONA
9 TEACHERS ACADEMY FUND IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR.

10 ~~F.~~ J. On or before ~~July 1, 2018~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2019 and each year
11 thereafter, the Arizona board of regents shall report to the governor, the
12 president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives,
13 and SHALL submit a copy to the secretary of state, on all of the
14 following:

15 1. The total number of students enrolled in the Arizona ~~teacher~~
16 TEACHERS academy ~~of~~ AT each ~~university~~ ELIGIBLE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION
