**CHAPTER 96**  
**SENATE BILL 1401**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 32-506, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO  
COSMETOLOGY.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2 Section 1. Section 32-506, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:  
4 32-506. Nonapplicability of chapter  
5 This chapter does not apply to the following persons while in the  
6 proper discharge of their professional duties:  
7 1. MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS WHO ARE LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS TITLE IF  
8 ~~THE practices for the treatment of TREAT physical or mental ailments or~~  
9 ~~disease by medical practitioners licensed pursuant to this title.~~  
10 2. Commissioned physicians and surgeons who are serving in the  
11 armed forces of the United States or other federal agencies.  
12 3. Persons who are licensed pursuant to chapter 3 or 12 of this  
13 title.  
14 4. Students who are attending schools licensed pursuant to this  
15 chapter while they are on school premises during school hours.  
16 5. Persons employed by theatrical groups who apply makeup, oils and  
17 cosmetics.  
18 6. Persons who sell makeup, oils and cosmetics and who apply such  
19 products during the process of selling such products.  
20 7. Shampoo assistants who shampoo hair under the direction of a  
21 cosmetologist or hairstylist licensed pursuant to this chapter.  
22 8. Services performed by and for persons WHO ARE in the custody of  
23 the state department of corrections.  
24 9. Persons who apply makeup, oils and cosmetics to patients in a  
25 hospital, nursing home or residential care institution with the consent of  
26 the patient and the hospital, nursing home or residential care  
27 institution.  
28 10. Persons who provide a service that results in tension on hair  
29 strands or roots by twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking or  
30 braiding, if the service does not include the application of dyes,  
31 reactive chemicals or other preparations to alter the color of the hair or  
32 to straighten, curl or alter the structure of the hair.  
33 11. Persons who provide threading.  
34 12. Persons who provide tanning services by means of airbrushing,  
35 tanning beds or spray tanning.  
36 13. Persons who apply makeup, including eyelash enhancements. This  
37 paragraph does not apply if a person is engaging in the practice of  
38 aesthetics or cosmetology. A person who is exempt pursuant to this  
39 paragraph shall post a sign in a conspicuous location in the person's  
40 place of business notifying the public that the person's services are not  
41 regulated by the board.

1           14. PERSONS WHO DRY, STYLE, ARRANGE, DRESS, CURL, HOT IRON OR  
2 SHAMPOO AND CONDITION HAIR IF THE SERVICE DOES NOT INCLUDE APPLYING  
3 REACTIVE CHEMICALS TO PERMANENTLY STRAIGHTEN, CURL OR ALTER THE STRUCTURE  
4 OF THE HAIR AND IF THE PERSON TAKES AND COMPLETES A CLASS RELATING TO  
5 SANITATION, INFECTION PROTECTION AND LAW REVIEW THAT IS PROVIDED BY THE  
6 BOARD OR ITS DESIGNEE. THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT APPLY IF A PERSON IS  
7 ENGAGING IN THE PRACTICE OF AESTHETICS OR COSMETOLOGY. A PERSON WHO IS  
8 EXEMPT PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL POST A SIGN IN A CONSPICUOUS  
9 LOCATION IN THE PERSON'S PLACE OF BUSINESS NOTIFYING THE PUBLIC THAT THE  
10 PERSON'S SERVICES ARE NOT REGULATED BY THE BOARD.
