

CHAPTER 68
SENATE BILL 1091

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 20-289, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO INSURANCE
PRODUCER LICENSING.

(TEXT OF BILL BEGINS ON NEXT PAGE)

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 20-289, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 20-289. Expiration; surrender; renewal

5 A. Any license that is issued pursuant to this article, other than
6 a temporary license, continues in force until it expires or the director
7 suspends, revokes or terminates the license. The license is also subject
8 to renewal pursuant to this section.

9 B. A license that is issued or renewed pursuant to this article or
10 a license that is issued or renewed pursuant to chapter 6, article 9 of
11 this title expires quadrennially as follows:

12 1. If the licensee is an individual, on the last day of the month
13 of the licensee's birthday, but not less than three years and not more
14 than four years after the last day of the month in which the license is
15 issued or is required to be renewed.

16 2. If the licensee is a business entity, on the last day of the
17 same month four years after the issuance or renewal due date of the
18 license as provided pursuant to this article.

19 C. The director may renew a license if the director receives from
20 the licensee all of the following on or before the license expiration
21 date:

22 1. An application on a form approved by the director.

23 2. The license fee prescribed in section 20-167.

24 3. Evidence that the licensee has complied with the continuing
25 education requirements prescribed in chapter 18 of this title.

26 D. Before renewing a license, the director may require the
27 applicant to:

28 1. Provide all documents that are reasonably necessary to verify
29 the information that is contained in the application and any other
30 information including prior criminal records.

31 2. Submit a full set of fingerprints to the department. The
32 department of insurance AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS shall submit the
33 fingerprints to the department of public safety for the purpose of
34 obtaining a state and federal criminal records check pursuant to section
35 41-1750 and Public Law 92-544. The department of public safety may
36 exchange this fingerprint data with the federal bureau of investigation.

37 E. Any license for which the director does not receive timely
38 application for renewal and full payment of fees expires at midnight on
39 the renewal date. During the year after the expiration of a license under
40 this section, a person who otherwise meets the qualifications for a
41 license may renew an expired license by filing with the director a renewal
42 application, the quadrennial license fee and an additional ~~one hundred~~
43 ~~dollars~~ \$100 as a late renewal fee. Any application that is received
44 during this ~~one year~~ ONE-YEAR period for the same license that expired
45 under this section is deemed a renewal application. Any application that

1 is received after the ~~one year~~ ONE-YEAR period for the same license that
2 expired under this section is deemed a new application.

3 F. On the written request of a person who is licensed pursuant to
4 this article, the director may accept the voluntary surrender of the
5 person's authority to transact one or more lines of insurance or of the
6 person's entire license. A person who surrenders an authority or a
7 license under this subsection ~~shall not reapply for the same authority or~~
8 ~~license for at least one year after the date of the surrender~~ MAY OBTAIN
9 THE SAME AUTHORITY OR LICENSE ONLY IF THE PERSON COMPLIES WITH THE
10 REQUIREMENTS THAT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO HAS NOT PREVIOUSLY HELD THE
11 AUTHORITY OR LICENSE.
