**Re: Final Results of the No Labels Party of Arizona Filing**

Dear No Labels Party,

The Secretary of State's Office has completed its final review in accordance with A.R.S. § 16-803(H) and issues the following findings:

- The Secretary of State's Office rejected 585 petition signatures pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-803(B).
- The Secretary of State's Office determined the remaining petition sheets contained 56,387 eligible signatures pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-803(B)(5).
- The Secretary of State's Office conducted a 20% random sample of eligible signatures on February 17, 2023, pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-803(C) and selected 11,278 total signatures for County Recorder verification.
- The County Recorders reported the following results from the random sample pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-803(E)-(F):
  - Apache County found that 0 petition signers were qualified electors, and 0 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Cochise County found that 136 petition signers were qualified electors, and 62 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Coconino County found that 270 petition signers were qualified electors, and 42 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Gila County found that 7 petition signers were qualified electors, and 1 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Graham County found that 0 petition signers were qualified electors, and 1 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Greenlee County found that 0 petition signers were qualified electors, and 2 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - La Paz County found that 0 petition signers were qualified electors, and 0 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Maricopa County found that 3,947 petition signers were qualified electors, and 1,706 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Mohave County found that 201 petition signers were qualified electors, and 40 petition signers were not qualified electors.

- Navajo County found that 6 petition signers were qualified electors, and 3 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Pima County found that 3,046 petition signers were qualified electors, and 533 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Pinal County found that 495 petition signers were qualified electors, and 89 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Santa Cruz County found that 44 petition signers were qualified electors, and 15 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Yavapai County found that 491 petition signers were qualified electors, and 137 petition signers were not qualified electors.
  - Yuma County found that 4 petition signers were qualified electors, and 0 petition signers were not qualified electors.
- To qualify for the ballot, the County Recorders were required to validate at least 6,825 total signatures, with no higher than a 39.48% failure rate (or no lower than a 60.52% validity rate).
  - The County Recorders validated 8,647 signatures and disqualified 2,631 signatures, resulting in a 23.33% signature failure rate (or an 76.67% validity rate).
  - Pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-803(H), the number invalidated by the county has been subtracted, and the invalid/valid rates have been applied to the remaining total. The estimated total number of valid signatures is 41,663, which exceeds the 34,127 minimum signatures required.
  - The No Labels Party exceeds the minimum signature requirement and, therefore, qualifies as a new party for federal, statewide, and legislative races in the 2024 Primary and General Elections under Arizona law.
