<p>The Arizona Drug and Gang Enforcement Task Force monitors the nature and scope of drug offenses and gang-related activity and related criminal activity in this state; recommends the following to the Criminal Justice Commission: specific purposes for monies in the drug enforcement account; specific programs for enhancing the deterrence, investigation, prosecution, adjudication, and punishment of drug offenders and members of criminal street gangs; constitutional, statutory, and administrative revisions which are necessary to enhance the above; and also evaluates and reports to the Commission the effectiveness of programs funded through the drug and gang enforcement account.</p> <p>The Task Force is comprised of the following members: the Governor or his designee, who shall serve as Chair; the Attorney General; the Director of the Department of Public Safety; the administrative director of the courts or a designee; a county attorney who is not a member of the Criminal Justice Commission and who is appointed by the Governor from a list recommended by the county attorneys of this state; a county sheriff who is not a member of the Criminal Justice Commission and who is appointed by the Governor from a list recommended by the county sheriffs of this state; and two police chiefs who are not members of the Commission who are appointed by the governor from a list recommended by the police chiefs of this state. STATE ASSETS, JOINT COMMITTEE ON

The Joint Committee on State Assets directs the staff of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee to collect all existing lists for state assets that have an individual replacement value of more than \$100,000, and to design form options for state agencies to use for the state assets that will facilitate periodic updates in a form useful to legislators; identifies and reports financial data for all buildings or other developed properties with an acquisition price of \$25,000 or more; selects certain assets and directs the Joint Legislative Budget Committee staff to prepare a cost benefits analysis of the assets it has selected; and files a copy of the asset inventory list with the Office of Excellence in Government.

The Committee consists of the following members: the chairpersons of the appropriations committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives who shall cochair the Committee; two members of the House of Representatives who are appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, no more than one of whom shall be from the same political party; two members of the Senate who are appointed by the President of the Senate, no more than one of whom shall be from the same political party; the Auditor General or a designee; the Director of the Department of Administration or a designee; the Director of the Department of Economic Security or a designee; two members who are appointed by the Governor and who have expertise in commercial real estate; one administrator who is appointed by the Governor and who is from a large agency under contract with this state to provide support services to clients who would otherwise be in a state institution; one administrator who is appointed by the Governor and who is from a small agency under contract with this state to provide services to clients who would otherwise be in a state institution; one member of the public who is appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and who has a background in business; one member of the public who is appointed by the President of the Senate and who has a background in business; and one member who is appointed by the Arizona Board of Regents and who is a part of the university system.

TOBACCO USE PREVENTION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Tobacco Use Prevention Advisory Committee reviews and makes recommendations to the Department of Health Services concerning the programs established and funded pursuant to A.R.S. § 42-1242.01.

The Committee is comprised of the following members: the Director of the Department of Health Services, or a designee, who shall serve as chair; two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who shall not represent the same political party; two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, who shall not represent the same political party; and six members of the public, two each appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, and the Governor, with expertise in public health education, programs to prevent or reduce tobacco use, or any combination of experience and knowledge which the appointing official determines to be valuable in providing advice or assistance to the Director of the Department of Health Services regarding the expenditure of health education monies.
