2. **Subject matter of the proposed rules:**

JOBSTART is a demonstration project that was authorized by Laws 1994, Ch. 301, § 2, and approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to Section 1115 of the Social Security Act. It is a component of the state's welfare reform EMPOWER Program. JOBSTART allows individuals receiving both AFDC and Food Stamps to work for public or private sector employers for minimum wage. The AFDC and food stamp benefits are then used to partially reimburse employers for wages paid to benefit recipients who work for the employers.

JOBSTART was piloted in the communities of Coolidge, Eloy, and Casa Grande. The Department plans to amend rule describing the geographic scope of pilot to include portions of eastern Maricopa County. This modification is needed to increase the client population eligible for JOBSTART. The Department needs a larger population than has been generated in the current geographic area to evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot.
