The Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health has adopted federal OSHA's Consultation Policies and Procedures Manual Chapter 7: Relationship to Enforcement, Directive #06-05(CSP 02).

2. Date the substantive policy statement was issued and the effective date of the policy statement if different from the issuance date:

December 14, 2006

3. Summary of the contents of the substantive policy statement:

This directive provides On-site Consultation Program visit guidance for Arizona On-site Consultation Projects and Arizona OSHA personnel. It identifies the On-site Consultation Program's relationship with Arizona OSHA Enforcement and the intersection of On-site Consultation services and programs and enforcement activity. This notice also outlines hazard correction and verification requirements. This notice cancels Chapter 6 (entitled Consultation Visit in Progress) of the Consultation Policies and Procedure Manual and replaces Chapter 7 entitled Recognition and Exemption Programs. The contents of the former Chapter 7 is now located in Chapter 8 of the Consultation Policies and Procedures Manual which was adopted by the Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health August 6, 2001. Significant changes found in this directive are: (A) Policies and procedures regarding pre-visit related requirements, scheduling and deferrals are now included. (B) Policies and procedures relating to Visit in PROGRESS status and enforcement activities have been included. (C) A new category of inspections determined by the Assistant Secretary to be critical has been added to the list of enforcement inspections that will result in the termination of IN PROGRESS status have been included. (D) This directive contains policies and procedures regarding the correction of hazards, correction due dates, employee protection inspections, and incidents that may trigger an On-site Consultation referral to Arizona OSHA enforcement.

1. Subject of the substantive policy statement and the substantive policy statement number by which the policy statement is referenced:

The Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health has adopted the federal OSHA's Consultation Policies and Procedures Manual Chapter 8: OSHA'S Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP) and Pre-SHARP, Directive # 06-06 (CSP 02).

2. Date the substantive policy statement was issued and the effective date of the policy statement if different from the issuance date:

December 14, 2006

3. Summary of the contents of the substantive policy statement:

This Directive provides policies and procedures for Consultation Projects and Arizona OSHA personnel relating to OSHA's Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP) and Pre-SHARP. This Directive cancels Chapter 7 of the Consultation Policies and Procedures Manual and replaces Chapter 8 entitled: "Monitoring of Consultation Projects". The content of the former Chapter 8 is located in Chapter 10 of this Manual that was adopted by Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health, August 6, 2001. Significant changes found in this Directive are: (A) OSHA has eliminated the size requirements for SHARP participation. However, priority for consultation services, including for SHARP and Pre-SHARP, shall remain for those employers with 250 or fewer employee's onsite. (B) All employers, whether they are in high-hazard industries or not, will be considered for participation in SHARP and Pre-SHARP. (C) Changing the terms used to allow for consistency with terms used on the OSHA Form 300. (D) Developed a alternative rate calculation method and an override provision have been adopted for calculating eligibility for participation in SHARP, which will impact both new and renewal SHARP sites. (E) Consultation Project Manager will now submit an employer's request for SHARP participation via web-based application. (F) The duration of SHARP exemption from OSHA programmed inspections both for initial approval and for the first renewal, is increased from one year to up to two years. (G) Employers at SHARP sites seeking renewal of their SHARP status must request a renewal visit within 180 days of the expiration of their exemption status.
