ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

The authenticated pdf of the *Administrative Register* (A.A.R.) posted on the Arizona Secretary of State's website is the official published version for rulemaking activity in the state of Arizona.

Rulemaking is defined in Arizona Revised Statutes known as the Arizona Administrative Procedure Act (APA), A.R.S. Title 41, Chapter 6, Articles 1 through 10.

The *Register* is cited by volume and page number. Volumes are published by calendar year with issues published weekly. Page numbering continues in each weekly issue.

In addition, the *Register* contains notices of rules terminated by the agency and rules that have expired.

ABOUT RULES

Rules can be: made (all new text); amended (rules on file, changing text); repealed (removing text); or renumbered (moving rules to a different Section number). Rulemaking activity published in the *Register* includes: proposed, final, emergency, expedited, and exempt rules as defined in the APA, and other state statutes.

New rules in this publication (whether proposed or made) are denoted with underlining; repealed text is stricken.

WHERE IS A "CLEAN" COPY OF THE FINAL OR EXEMPT RULE PUBLISHED IN THE REGISTER?

The *Arizona Administrative Code* (A.A.C.) contains the codified text of rules. The A.A.C. contains rules promulgated and filed by state agencies that have been approved by the Attorney General or the Governor's Regulatory Review Council. The *Code* also contains rules exempt from the rulemaking process.

The authenticated pdf of *Code* Chapters posted on the Arizona Secretary of State's website are the official published version of rules in the A.A.C. The *Code* is posted online for free.

LEGAL CITATIONS AND FILING NUMBERS

On the cover: Each agency is assigned a Chapter in the *Arizona Administrative Code* under a specific Title. Titles represent broad subject areas. The Title number is listed first; with the acronym A.A.C., which stands for the *Arizona Administrative Code*; following the Chapter number and Agency name, then program name. For example, the Secretary of State has rules on rulemaking in Title 1, Chapter 1 of the *Arizona Administrative Code*. The citation for this Chapter is 1 A.A.C. 1, Secretary of State, Rules and Rulemaking. Every document filed in the office is assigned a file number. This number, enclosed in brackets, is located at the top right of the published documents in the *Register*. The original filed document is available for 10 cents a page.

Participate in the Process

Look for the Agency Notice

Review (inspect) notices published in the *Arizona Administrative Register*. Many agencies maintain stakeholder lists and would be glad to inform you when they proposed changes to rules. Check an agency's website and its newsletters for news about notices and meetings.

Feel like a change should be made to a rule and an agency has not proposed changes? You can petition an agency to make, amend, or repeal a rule. The agency must respond to the petition. (See A.R.S. § 41-1033)

Attend a public hearing/meeting

Attend a public meeting that is being conducted by the agency on a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. Public meetings may be listed in the Preamble of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking or they may be published separately in the *Register*. Be prepared to speak, attend the meeting, and make an oral comment.

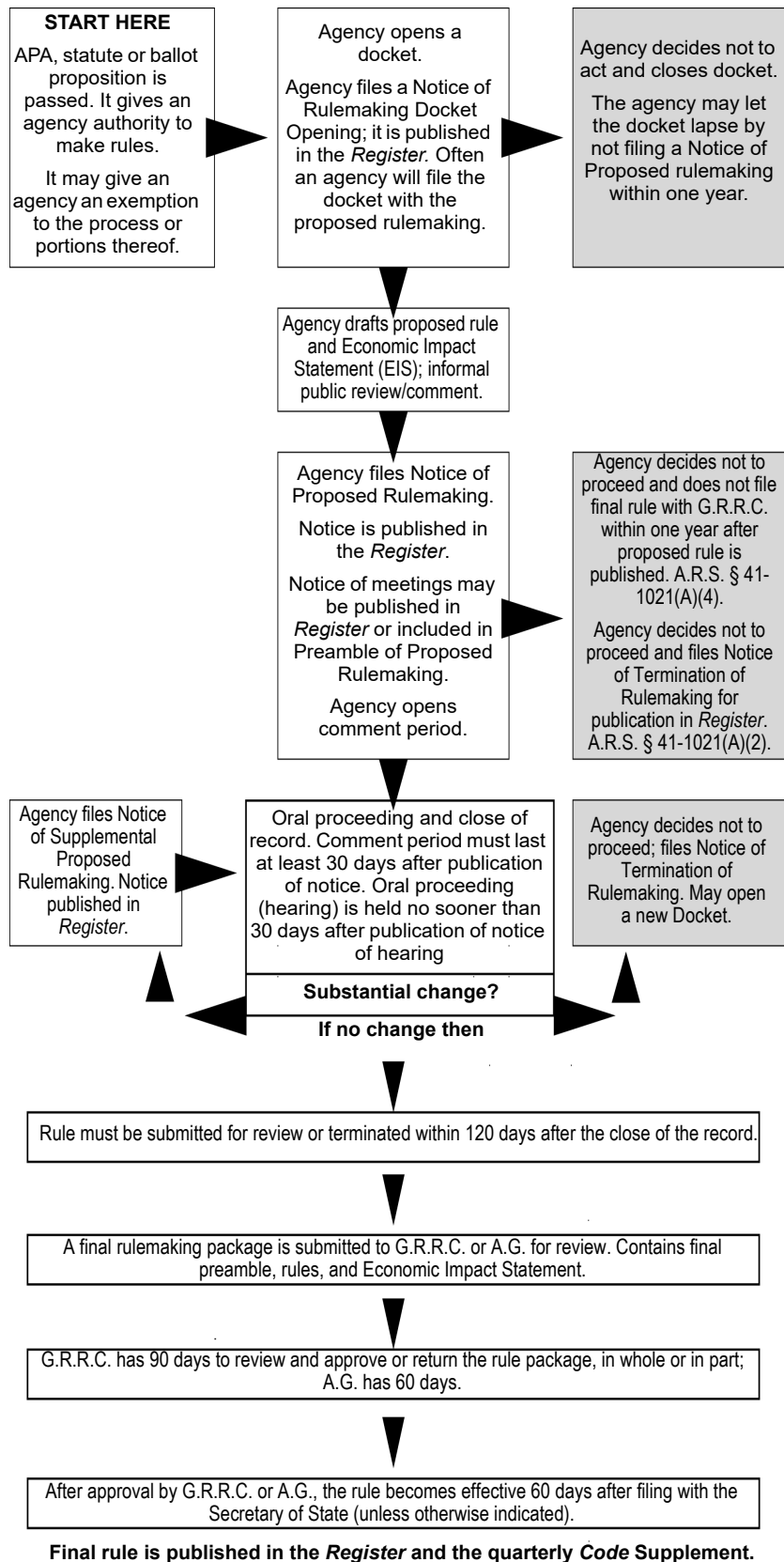
An agency may not have a public meeting scheduled on the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. If not, you may request that the agency schedule a proceeding. This request must be put in writing within 30 days after the published Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

Write the agency

Put your comments in writing to the agency. In order for the agency to consider your comments, the agency must receive them by the close of record. The comment must be received within the 30-day comment timeframe following the *Register* publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

You can also submit to the Governor's Regulatory Review Council written comments that are relevant to the Council's power to review a given rule (A.R.S. § 41-1052). The Council reviews the rule at the end of the rulemaking process and before the rules are filed with the Secretary of State.

Arizona Regular Rulemaking Process



Definitions

Arizona Administrative Code (A.A.C.): Official rules codified and published by the Secretary of State's Office. Available online at www.azsos.gov.

Arizona Administrative Register (A.A.R.): The official publication that includes filed documents pertaining to Arizona rulemaking. Available online at www.azsos.gov.

Administrative Procedure Act (APA): A.R.S. Title 41, Chapter 6, Articles 1 through 10. Available online at www.azleg.gov.

Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.): The statutes are made by the Arizona State Legislature during a legislative session. They are compiled by Legislative Council, with the official publication codified by Thomson West. Citations to statutes include Titles which represent broad subject areas. The Title number is followed by the Section number. For example, A.R.S. § 41-1001 is the definitions Section of Title 41 of the Arizona Administrative Procedures Act. The "§" symbol simply means "section." Available online at www.azleg.gov.

Chapter: A division in the codification of the *Code* designating a state agency or, for a large agency, a major program.

Close of Record: The close of the public record for a proposed rulemaking is the date an agency chooses as the last date it will accept public comments, either written or oral.

Code of Federal Regulations (CFR): The *Code of Federal Regulations* is a codification of the general and permanent rules published in the *Federal Register* by the executive departments and agencies of the federal government.

Docket: A public file for each rulemaking containing materials related to the proceedings of that rulemaking. The docket file is established and maintained by an agency from the time it begins to consider making a rule until the rulemaking is finished. The agency provides public notice of the docket by filing a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening with the Office for publication in the *Register*.

Economic, Small Business, and Consumer Impact Statement (EIS): The EIS identifies the impact of the rule on private and public employment, on small businesses, and on consumers. It includes an analysis of the probable costs and benefits of the rule. An agency includes a brief summary of the EIS in its preamble. The EIS is not published in the *Register* but is available from the agency promulgating the rule. The EIS is also filed with the rulemaking package.

Governor's Regulatory Review (G.R.R.C.): Reviews and approves rules to ensure that they are necessary and to avoid unnecessary duplication and adverse impact on the public. G.R.R.C. also assesses whether the rules are clear, concise, understandable, legal, consistent with legislative intent, and whether the benefits of a rule outweigh the cost.

Incorporated by Reference: An agency may incorporate by reference standards or other publications. These standards are available from the state agency with references on where to order the standard or review it online.

Federal Register (FR): The *Federal Register* is a legal newspaper published every business day by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). It contains federal agency regulations; proposed rules and notices; and executive orders, proclamations, and other presidential documents.

Session Laws or "Laws": When an agency references a law that has not yet been codified into the Arizona Revised Statutes, use the word "Laws" is followed by the year the law was passed by the Legislature, followed by the Chapter number using the abbreviation "Ch.," and the specific Section number using the Section symbol (§). For example, Laws 1995, Ch. 6, § 2. Session laws are available at www.azleg.gov.

United States Code (U.S.C.): The Code is a consolidation and codification by subject matter of the general and permanent laws of the United States. The Code does not include regulations issued by executive branch agencies, decisions of the federal courts, treaties, or laws enacted by state or local governments.

About Preambles

The Preamble is the part of a rulemaking package that contains information about the rulemaking and provides agency justification and regulatory intent.

It includes reference to the specific statutes authorizing the agency to make the rule, an explanation of the rule, reasons for proposing the rule, and the preliminary Economic Impact Statement.

The information in the Preamble differs between rulemaking notices used and the stage of the rulemaking.

NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

This section of the *Arizona Administrative Register* contains Notices of Proposed Rulemaking.

A proposed rulemaking is filed by an agency upon completion and submittal of a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening. Often these two documents are filed at the same time and published in the same *Register* issue.

When an agency files a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), the notice is published in the *Register* within three weeks of filing. See the publication schedule in the back of each issue of the *Register* for more information.

Under the APA, an agency must allow at least 30 days to elapse after the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Register* before beginning any proceedings for making, amending, or repealing any rule (A.R.S. §§ 41-1013 and 41-1022).

The Office of the Secretary of State is the filing office and publisher of these rules. Questions about the interpretation of the proposed rules should be addressed to the agency that promulgated the rules. Refer to item #4 below to contact the person charged with the rulemaking and item #10 for the close of record and information related to public hearings and oral comments.

The Arizona State Board of Dispensing Opticians is requesting a fee increase after 20 years.

Justification:

Occupational licensing is critical to ensure that professionals across various fields meet established safety, quality and competency standards. These licenses protect consumers and practitioners by preventing fraud, maintaining professional ethics and upholding public safety.

Amid rapid changes in our economy, the increasing costs of administration and growing demand for regulatory oversight have placed significant strain on the resources available to agencies overseeing these licenses.

Budget Constraints and Fiscal Responsibility:

State agencies have been contending with stagnant budgets that do not reflect rising service costs.

The demand for regulatory oversight has grown significantly, yet budget appropriations have not adjusted accordingly. Raising occupational licensing fees is not just a means of generating revenue—it is a strategic necessity to maintain operational.

Efficiency:

Without an increase, the Board's financial balance is projected to decline by approximately 15% annually, assuming revenue remains consistent while expenses continue to rise. Under current statutes (A.R.S. § 1685), the Board can collect up to \$200 in

annual licensing fees. However, fees have remained unchanged since at least 2005 despite a steady rise in operating costs. Increasing the fee to the statutory limit would ensure financial stability, allowing the Board to continue providing essential services without compromising quality. It should be noted that 15% of the Board's revenue is contributed to the state's general fund, further supporting broader public services.

Conclusion:

Without increasing licensing fees, the Board risks financial instability and the inability to meet its obligations effectively. Raising the fee to the statutory maximum is necessary to maintain high-quality regulatory oversight, boost operational efficiency and allow the Board to continue supporting the public interest.

- 6. An agency's justification and reason why a rule should be made, amended, repealed or renumbered, to include an explanation about the rulemaking:**
 The Arizona Department of Insurance and Financial Institutions, Division of Financial Institutions, Real Estate Appraisal ("Department") seeks to amend Sections R4-46-402, R4-46-403, R4-46-404, and R4-46-405 governing Appraisal Management Companies. These rules dovetail with the statutory sections governing an Appraisal Management Company ("AMC") found at Title 32, Chapter 36, Article 5, §§ 32-3661 through 32-3680.
 The changes to these rules are to clarify that it is an AMC's responsibility to ensure the Department is notified of certain changes, renewal information, and certifications. The Department is removing some of these responsibilities from the controlling person because they are not required by statute and an AMC may use other entities for its renewal process.
 This change does not relate to a Five-Year Review Report.
- 7. A reference to any study relevant to the rule that the agency reviewed and proposes either to rely on or not to rely on in its evaluation of or justification for the rule, where the public may obtain or review each study, all data underlying each study, and any analysis of each study and other supporting material:**
 The Division did not review and does not propose to rely on any study relevant to this rulemaking.

12 CFR 34.210 through 12 CFR 34.216 (Real Estate Lending and Appraisals; Appraisal Management Company's Minimum Requirements) is applicable to state regulation of AMC's. 12 CFR 34.213 (Appraisal Management Company Registration) is specifically applicable to state regulations governing the registration of AMCs. The Federal Regulation makes no mention of a "controlling person" but affords the State leeway in operating a licensing program including renewing the AMC's registration periodically (12 CFR 34.213(a)(2)), requiring the AMC to submit reports, information and documents (12 CFR 34.213(a)(3)), and suspending or terminating the registration of an AMC that violates applicable appraisal-related laws or regulations (12 CFR 34.213(a)(6)).

12 CFR 225.193 (Federal Reserve System Bank Holding Companies – Appraisal Management Registration) has identical requirements at 12 CFR 225.193(a).

The rules are not more stringent than the federal regulations.

No formal analysis has been submitted to the Division that compares the rule's impact of the competitiveness of business in this state to the impact of business in other states.

ARTICLE 4. APPRAISAL MANAGEMENT COMPANIES**R4-46-402. Bond Required**

- A. The surety bond required under A.R.S. § 32-3667 shall be in the amount of \$20,000 and shall be issued by a surety company authorized to do business in Arizona.
- B. The controlling person of a registered AMC shall ensure that the surety bond required under A.R.S. § 32-3667 requires the issuing surety company to provide written notice to the Department by registered or certified mail at least 30 days before the surety company cancels the bond and within 30 days after the surety company pays a loss under the bond.
- C. The surety bond required under A.R.S. § 32-3667 is to be used exclusively to ensure that a registered AMC pays:
1. All amounts owed to persons that perform real estate appraisal services for the AMC, and
 2. All amounts adjudged against the AMC as a result of either negligent or improper real property appraisal services or appraisal management services or of a breach of contract in performing real property appraisal services or appraisal management services.
- D. The controlling person of a registered AMC shall ensure that the required surety bond is:
1. Maintained in the amount of \$20,000;
 2. Funded to \$20,000 within seven days after being drawn down; and
 3. Maintained for at least one year after the AMC's registration expires, is revoked or surrendered, or otherwise ends.
- E. If the Department receives notice from the surety company of intent to cancel the required bond, the Department shall notify the controlling person of the AMC and require that the ~~controlling person~~ AMC submit proof of a replacement bond before the existing bond is cancelled. Under A.R.S. § 32-3678, failure to maintain the required bond is grounds for disciplinary action.
- F. If a registered AMC operates in Arizona under more than one name, other than a DBA, the controlling person shall ensure that a separate surety bond in the amount of \$20,000 is maintained in each name.
- G. If the name of a registered AMC is changed, the controlling person of the registered AMC shall ensure that a surety bond in the amount of \$20,000 is:
1. Maintained in the former name for one year after the name is changed, and
 2. Obtained in the registered AMC's new name.
- H. A person damaged by a registered AMC's failure to pay an obligation listed in subsection (C) has a right of action against the surety bond. The damaged person shall begin the action in a court of competent jurisdiction within one year after the AMC failed to pay the amount owed or the amount adjudged against the AMC.
- I. If the surety bond required under A.R.S. § 32-3667 is cancelled, liability of the issuing surety company is not limited or cancelled regarding any claim against the surety bond for actions by the AMC while the surety bond was in force.

R4-46-404. Application for Renewal Registration

- A. Under A.R.S. § 32-3665, an initial registration for an AMC expires one year after the date of issuance. A renewal registration for an AMC expires two years after the date of issuance.

- Medical coverage through AHCCCS or the state's Medicaid plan when the child resides in another state;
- Nonrecurring expenses (one-time expenses) to cover necessary legal expenses related to the adoption of the child;
- Monthly maintenance payments to adoptive parents to assist with covering expenses related to the child's special needs;
- Special services subsidy to cover medically necessary services that are not available through any other community resource; and
- Case management and advocacy for children receiving adoption subsidy.

In 2018, Laws 2018 Chapter 161 was passed to amend A.R.S. §8-143 to allow Title 8 permanent guardians, who were appointed by the court and later decide to adopt the child in their care, to apply for adoption subsidy through the Department of Child Safety. The proposed amendments in this rulemaking align with the statutory amendment. The subsidy provided as a result of the statutory amendment is paid at the same rate as the permanent guardian subsidy agreements; therefore, there is no financial impact.

Children and young adults who are recipients of these services are not charged a fee. The Department of Child Safety provides these services through federal funds and about 31% of the Adoption Subsidy Agreements are funded through General State funds for children and young adults who do not qualify for federal funded services.

- R21-5-510: In 2018, A.R.S. § 8-144 changed the review requirement of adoption subsidy from annual to periodic reviews. The section title and R21-5-510(A) need to be updated to reflect the statutory change.
- R21-5-511: In 2019, A.R.S. § 8-144 changed eligibility and allows children to continue receiving adoption subsidy past high school graduation if they were adopted at age 16 or 17 and meet the criteria established in statute. This section needs to be amended to include the statutory changes.
