ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION

The authenticated pdf of the *Administrative Register* (A.A.R.) posted on the Office of the Secretary of State's website is the official published version for rulemaking activity in the state of Arizona. The *Register* is published weekly by issue number, every Friday by the Administrative Rules Division.

The *Register* is cited by volume and page number. Volumes are published by calendar year. Page numbering continues in each weekly issue.

The *Register* contains notices of docket openings, proposed, final, emergency, expedited, exempt, and terminated rules as defined in Arizona Revised Statutes known as the Arizona Administrative Procedure Act (APA), and A.R.S. Title 41, Chapter 6, Articles 1 through 10. Other "notice only" filings are published in the *Register* which includes Informal Public Meetings on an Open Rulemaking Docket, Formal Rulemaking Advisory Committees, Public Information, Oral Proceedings, Public Hearings, Public Meetings, Agency Guidance Documents, Substantive Policy Statements, Proposed Delegation Agreements, Final Delegation Agreements, and Agency Ombudsman.

ABOUT AMENDMENTS TO RULES

Rulemaking is defined in the APA. Rules can be made (all new text); amended (changed) or repealed (removed) as codified in the *Arizona Administrative Code*; or renumbered (moving rules to a different Section number). New rules published in the *Register*, whether proposed or made as a final rule, are underlined; repealed rules (text being removed), is stricken.

ABOUT THE TABLE OF CONTENTS

On the cover: Each agency is assigned a Chapter in the *Arizona Administrative Code* under a specific Title. Titles represent broad subject areas. The Title number is listed first; with the acronym A.A.C., which stands for the *Arizona Administrative Code*; following the Chapter number and Agency name, then program name. For example, the Secretary of State has rules on rulemaking in Title 1, Chapter 1 of the *Arizona Administrative Code*. The citation for this Chapter is 1 A.A.C. 1, Secretary of State, Rules and Rulemaking.

ABOUT FILE NUMBERS

Notices filed in the Division are assigned a file number. This number is enclosed in brackets and located at the top right of the published documents in the *Register*. Original filed notices are available in pdf for free. For a copy, contact our Division with the file number.

ABOUT THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The *Arizona Administrative Code* (A.A.C.) contains codified text of rules. When published, the underling and striking of text in notices as published in the *Register* are removed. The codified rules have either been approved by the Governor's Regulatory Review Council or Attorney General as prescribed under the APA. The *Code* also contains rules exempt from the rulemaking process, and emergency rules. The authenticated pdf of *Code* Chapters posted on the Office of the Secretary of State's website are the official published version of rules in the A.A.C. The *Code* is posted online for free.

Participate in Rulemaking

Review Published Notices

Those interested in participating in the rulemaking process should review notices published in the *Arizona Administrative Register*.

The Preamble at the beginning of a notice contains information about the rulemaking and provides agency justification and regulatory intent. Agency contact information is published in the Preamble for those interested in participating in the rulemaking process.

The Preamble includes reference to the specific statutes authorizing the agency to make the rule, an explanation of the rule, reasons for proposing the rule, and the preliminary Economic Impact Statement.

Agency Contact Lists

Many agencies maintain stakeholder lists to contact those interested in proposed changes to rules. Check an agency's website and its newsletters for information about notices, oral proceedings, and meetings. Feel like a change should be made to a rule and an agency has not proposed changes? You can petition an agency to make, amend, or repeal a rule. The agency must respond to the petition. Refer to A.R.S. § 41-1033 for more information.

Attend a Public Meeting

Stakeholders can attend a public meeting, known as an oral proceeding, being conducted by the agency on a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. A proceeding may be listed in the Preamble of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking or an agency may inform the public of the meeting in a Notice of Oral Proceeding. Attend the meeting and be prepared to speak and comment.

An agency may not have a public meeting scheduled on the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. If not, you may request the agency schedule a proceeding. This request must be put in writing within 30 days after the published Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

Refer to information in the Preamble.

Write the Agency

Put your comments in writing and send them to the agency. In order for the agency to consider your comments, the agency must receive them by the close of record. The comment must be received within the 30-day comment timeframe following the *Register* publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

You can also submit to the Governor's Regulatory Review Council written comments that are relevant to the Council's power to review a given rule (A.R.S. § 41-1052).

The Council reviews the rule at the end of the rulemaking process, before the rules are filed with the Secretary of State.

THE REGULAR RULEMAKING PROCESS

Authority

An agency is given the authority to promulgate a rule under the APA, statute passed by the Legislature, or ballot proposition, which is passed by the voters.

An agency may be given certain exemptions to the APA or portions thereof.

Information about the exemptions are provided in the Preamble of the rulemaking.

Permission to Proceed

Before moving forward with any notice, an agency first receives permission from the governor's office to proceed with a rulemaking.

The governor's office provides the agency a written response to proceed that is filed with the notice.

Stakeholder and Public Notification

The agency opens a docket. It is filed as a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening for publication in the *Register*.

The notice includes agency contact information along with its intentions to make, amend, repeal, or renumber, a rule and its justification to perform the rulemaking action. Often an agency will file the docket with the proposed rulemaking.

An agency may decide not to proceed and not file final rule with G.R.R.C. within one year after proposed rule is published. A.R.S. § 41-1021(A)(4)

Agency Proposes Rules, Public Reviews Proposal

The agency files a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and the notice is published in the *Register*.

The public is given the opportunity to comment on the proposed rules. The agency opens the comment period to last at least 30 days. Written comments are accepted informally.

The notice *may* contain information about oral proceedings.

A proceeding is held no sooner than 30 days after the notice is published.

If no proceeding is scheduled, the agency provides information on how a person may request to speak to the agency in person at an oral proceeding.

Oral Proceeding

A person requests an agency to conduct an oral proceeding based on the information provided in its Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

The agency prepares a Notice of Oral Proceeding on Proposed Rulemaking, schedules one or more proceeding, and files the notice for publication in the *Register*.

When it occurs, an agency extends the public comment period.

Close of Record

After evaluating public comments and conducting an internal review of the rule, an agency:

1. Determines whether the rulemaking requires a substantial change. When an agency decides to make substantial changes to a proposed rule, it continues the process as outlined under the APA. The agency obtains permission to proceed as stated under #2 of this timeline. The agency prepares a Notice of Supplemental Proposed Rulemaking with the changes and files it for publication in the *Register*. Comments are once again solicited and reviewed by the agency.
2. Prepares and submits for review a Notice of Final Rulemaking for review and approval by G.R.R.C. or Attorney General. The Notice of Final Rulemaking must be submitted for review within 120 days after the close of record; or
3. Terminates the rulemaking. The agency may decide to terminate its docket and files a notice for publication in the *Register* notifying stakeholders of the termination. Refer to A.R.S. § 41-1021(A)(2).

Time Frame for Approval or Disapproval of the Notice

G.R.R.C. has 90 days to review and approve or return the rule package, in whole or in part; A.G. has 60 days.

The Approved Rule is Published in *Register* and Codified in the Code

After approval by G.R.R.C. or A.G., the rule becomes effective 60 days after filing the notice with the Office of the Secretary of State, unless otherwise indicated in the Preamble of the notice.

The Notice of Final Rulemaking is published in the *Register* and codified in the *Arizona Administrative Code*.

Definitions and Acronyms

Arizona Administrative Code, Code (A.A.C.): Official rules codified and published by the Secretary of State's Office. Available online at www.azsos.gov.

Arizona Administrative Register, Register (A.A.R.): The official publication that includes filed documents pertaining to Arizona rulemaking. Available online at www.azsos.gov.

Administrative Procedure Act (APA): A.R.S. Title 41, Chapter 6, Articles 1 through 10. Available online at www.azleg.gov.

Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.): The statutes are made by the Arizona State Legislature during a legislative session. They are compiled by Legislative Council, with the official publication codified by Thomson Reuters. Citations to statutes include Titles which represent broad subject areas. The Title number is followed by the Section number. For example, A.R.S. § 41-1001 is the definitions Section of Title 41 of the Arizona Administrative Procedures Act. The “§” symbol simply means “section.” Available online at www.azleg.gov.

Chapter: A division in the codification of the *Code* designating a state agency or, for a large agency, a major program.

Close of Record: The close of the public record for a proposed rulemaking is the date an agency chooses as the last date it will accept public comments, either written or oral.

Code of Federal Regulations (CFR): The *Code of Federal Regulations* is a codification of the general and permanent rules published in the *Federal Register* by the executive departments and agencies of the federal government.

Docket: A public file for each rulemaking containing materials related to the proceedings of that rulemaking. The docket file is established and maintained by an agency from the time it begins to consider making a rule until the rulemaking is finished. The agency provides public notice of the docket by filing a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening with the Office for publication in the *Register*.

Economic, Small Business, and Consumer Impact Statement (EIS): The EIS identifies the impact of the rule on private and public employment, on small businesses, and on consumers. It includes an analysis of the probable costs and benefits of the rule. An agency includes a brief summary of the EIS in its preamble. The EIS is not published in the *Register* but is available from the agency promulgating the rule. The EIS is also filed with the rulemaking package.

Governor's Regulatory Review (G.R.R.C.): Reviews and approves rules to ensure that they are necessary and to avoid unnecessary duplication and adverse impact on the public. G.R.R.C. also assesses whether the rules are clear, concise, understandable, legal, consistent with legislative intent, and whether the benefits of a rule outweigh the cost.

Incorporated by Reference: An agency may incorporate by reference standards or other publications. These standards are available from the state agency with references on where to order the standard or review it online.

Federal Register (FR): The *Federal Register* is a legal newspaper published every business day by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). It contains federal agency regulations; proposed rules and notices; and executive orders, proclamations, and other presidential documents.

Session Laws or “Laws”: When an agency references a law that has not yet been codified into the Arizona Revised Statutes, use the word “Laws” is followed by the year the law was passed by the Legislature, followed by the Chapter number using the abbreviation “Ch.,” and the specific Section number using the Section symbol (§). For example, Laws 1995, Ch. 6, § 2. Session laws are available at www.azleg.gov.

United States Code (U.S.C.): The Code is a consolidation and codification by subject matter of the general and permanent laws of the United States. The Code does not include regulations issued by executive branch agencies, decisions of the federal courts, treaties, or laws enacted by state or local governments.

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NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Administrative Procedure Act (APA) requires an agency file a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening which outlines its rulemaking intentions under [A.R.S. § 41-1021](#). A docket opening and Notice of Proposed Rulemaking are often filed at the same time and published in the same *Register* issue. If they are not filed at the same time, information on where the docket opening was published is listed in the preamble of the proposed rulemaking.

An agency must allow at least 30 days to elapse after the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Register* before scheduling any oral proceedings. Written public comments shall be accepted for at least 30 days after the published notice. Refer to A.R.S. §§ [41-1013](#), [41-1022](#) and [41-1023](#).

Questions about the notice can be answered by the person listed in item #5 of the preamble.

Refer to item #11 of the preamble for information on how to comment on this notice, the close of record to comment, and information related to oral proceedings.

The statutory changes needing to be addressed were related to licensure by universal recognition, expedited licensure under the interstate compact, mental health of applicants, and students who graduate from an unapproved allopathic medical school.

Because the rulemaking establishes procedures for applying for three new license types and one registration and establishes authorized fees for the three license types, the rulemaking will have an economic effect on applicants who apply for one of the new license types and on the Board. The fees established for the three license types are the same as those currently existing for comparable license types. The rulemaking will have a positive economic benefit on applicants and licensees who no longer have to disclose confidential monitoring agreements and who have to disclose only ten years of malpractice matters.

- A. For purposes of this Article, unless otherwise specified:
1. “ABMS” means American Board of Medical Specialties.
 2. “ECFMG” means Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates.
 3. “FCVS” means Federation Credentials Verification Service.
 4. “FLEX” means Federation Licensing Examination.
 5. “IMLC” means the interstate medical licensure compact created under A.R.S. § 32-3241.

- B. An applicant for licensure to practice medicine by Step 3 of the USMLE or endorsement shall submit the following information on an application form available on request from the Board and on the Board’s website:
1. Applicant’s full name, Social Security number, business and home addresses, primary e-mail address, business and home telephone numbers, and date and place of birth;
 2. Name of the school of medicine from which the applicant graduated and date of graduation;
 3. A complete list of the applicant’s internship, residency, and fellowship training;
 4. List of all licensing examinations taken;
 5. Names of the states, U.S. territories, or provinces in which the applicant has applied for or been granted a license or registration to practice medicine, including license number, date issued, and current status of the license;
 6. A statement of whether the applicant:
 - a. Has had an application for medical licensure denied or rejected by another state or province licensing board, and if so, an explanation;

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- b. Has ever had any disciplinary or rehabilitative action taken against the applicant by another licensing board, including other health professions, and if so, an explanation;
 - c. Has had any disciplinary actions, restrictions, or limitations taken against the applicant while participating in any type of training program or by any health care provider, and if so, an explanation;
 - d. Has been found in violation of a statute, rule, or regulation of any domestic or foreign governmental agency, and if so, an explanation;
 - e. Is currently under investigation by any medical board or peer review body, and if so, an explanation;
 - f. Has been subject to discipline resulting in a medical license being revoked, suspended, limited, cancelled during investigation, restricted, or voluntarily surrendered, or resulting in probation or entry into a consent agreement or stipulation and if so, an explanation;
 - g. Has had hospital privileges revoked, denied, suspended, or restricted, and if so, an explanation;
 - h. Has been named as a defendant in a malpractice matter currently pending or that resulted in a settlement or judgment against the applicant within the last 10 years, and if so, an explanation;
 - i. Has been subjected to any regulatory disciplinary action, including censure, practice restriction, suspension, sanction, or removal from practice, imposed by any agency of the federal or state government, and if so, an explanation;
 - j. Has had the authority to prescribe, dispense, or administer medications limited, restricted, modified, denied, surrendered, or revoked by a federal or state agency as a result of disciplinary or other adverse action, and if so, an explanation;
 - k. Has been found guilty or entered into a plea of no contest to a felony, a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude in any state, and if so, an explanation;
7. Whether the applicant is currently certified by any of the American Board of Medical Specialties;
 8. The applicant's intended specialty;
 9. Consistent with the Board's authority at A.R.S. § 32-1422(B), other information the Board may deem necessary to evaluate the applicant fully;
 10. Whether the applicant completed a training unit prescribed by the Board regarding the requirements of A.R.S. Title 32, Chapter 13 and this Chapter;
 11. In addition to the answers provided under subsections (B)(1) through (10), the applicant shall answer the following confidential question:
 - a. Whether the applicant currently has a medical condition that impairs the applicant's ability to practice medicine in a competent, ethical, and professional manner;
 - b. If the answer to subsection (B)(11)(a) is yes:
 - i. Provide an explanation of the medical condition; and
 - ii. If currently practicing under a non-confidential monitoring agreement with a licensing board in another state, attach a copy of the non-confidential monitoring agreement to the application; and
 12. A notarized statement, signed by the applicant, verifying the truthfulness of the information provided, and that the applicant has not engaged in any acts prohibited by Arizona law or Board rules, and authorizing release of any required records or documents to complete application review.
- C. In addition to the application form required under subsection (B), an applicant for licensure to practice medicine by Step 3 of the USMLE or endorsement shall submit the following:
1. A copy of the applicant's birth certificate or passport that is:
 - a. Notarized, or
 - b. Certified by a governmental agency.
 2. Evidence of legal name change if the applicant's legal name is different from that shown on the document submitted under subsection (C)(1);
 3. Documentation listed under A.R.S. § 41-1080(A) showing that the applicant's presence in the U.S. is authorized under federal law;
 4. Complete list of all medical employment for the five years before the date of application;
 5. Verification of any medical malpractice matter currently pending or resulting in a settlement or judgment against the applicant within the last 10 years, including a copy of the complaint and either the agreed terms of settlement or the judgment and a narrative statement specifying the nature of the occurrence resulting in the medical malpractice action. An applicant who is unable to obtain a document required under this subsection may apply under subsection (E) a waiver of the requirement;
 6. A full set of fingerprints and the processing charge specified in R4-16-205;
 7. A paper or digital headshot photograph of the applicant taken no more than 60 days before the date of application; and
 8. The fee authorized under A.R.S. § 32-1436 and specified in R4-16-205.
- D. In addition to the requirements of subsections (B) and (C), an applicant for licensure to practice medicine by Step 3 of the USMLE or endorsement shall have the following submitted to the Board, electronically or in hard copy, by the primary source, ECFMG, Veridoc, or FCVS:
1. Official transcript or other authentication of graduation from a school of medicine;
 2. Verification of completion of postgraduate training;
 3. Verification of ECFMG certification if the applicant graduated from an unapproved school of medicine;
 4. Examination and Board history report scores for USMLE, FLEX, NBME, and SPEX;
 5. Verification of LMCC exam score or state written exam score;
 6. Verification of licensure from every state in which the applicant has ever held a medical license;
 7. ~~Verification of all hospital affiliations during the five years before the date of application. Under A.R.S. § 32-1422(A)(11)(b), this verification is required to be on the hospital's official letterhead or the electronic equivalent; and~~

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- 8-7. Verification of all medical employment during the five years before the date of application. Under A.R.S. § 32-1422(A)(11)(b), this verification may be submitted by the employer.
- E. As provided under A.R.S. § 32-1422(F), the Board may waive a documentation requirement specified under subsections (C)(5) and (D).
1. To obtain a waiver under this subsection, an applicant shall submit a written request that includes the following information:
 - a. Applicant's name;
 - b. Date of request;
 - c. Document required under subsection (C)(5) or (D) for which waiver is requested;
 - d. Detailed description of efforts made by the applicant to provide the document as required under subsection (C)(5) or (D);
 - e. Reason the applicant's inability to provide the document as required under subsection (C)(5) or (D) is due to no fault of the applicant; and
 - f. If applicable, documents that support the request for waiver.
 2. The Board shall consider the request for waiver at its next regularly scheduled meeting.
 3. In determining whether to grant the request for waiver, the Board shall consider whether the applicant:
 - a. Made appropriate and sufficient effort to satisfy the requirement under subsection (C)(5) or (D); and
 - b. Demonstrated that compliance with the requirement under subsection (C)(5) or (D) is not possible because:
 - i. The entity responsible for issuing the required document no longer exists;
 - ii. The original of the required document was destroyed by accident or natural disaster;
 - iii. The entity responsible for issuing the required document is unable to provide verification because of armed conflict or political strife; or
 - iv. Another valid reason beyond the applicant's control prevents compliance with the requirement under subsection (C)(5) or (D).
 4. In determining whether to grant the request for waiver, the Board shall:
 - a. Consider whether it is possible for the Board to obtain the required document from other source; and
 - b. Request the applicant to obtain and provide additional information the Board believes will facilitate the Board's decision.
 5. If the Board determines the applicant is unable to comply with a requirement under subsection (C)(5) or (D) in spite of the applicant's best effort and for a reason beyond the applicant's control, the Board may grant the request for waiver and include the decision in the Board's official record for the applicant.
 6. The Board shall provide the applicant with written notice of its decision regarding the request for waiver. The Board's decision is not subject to review or appeal.
- F. As provided under A.R.S. § 32-1426(B), the Board may require an applicant for licensure by endorsement who passed an examination specified in A.R.S. § 32-1426(A) more than ten years before the date of application to provide evidence the applicant is able to engage safely in the practice of medicine. The Board may consider one or more of the following to determine whether the applicant is able to engage safely in the practice of medicine:
1. Whether the applicant is board certified by one of the specialties recognized by the ABMS. If the applicant holds a current ABMS certification, this criterion is considered met.
 2. Whether the applicant takes and passes the SPEX examination. If the applicant obtains a passing score on the SPEX examination, this criterion is considered met.
 3. The Board may also consider any combination of the following:
 - a. The applicant's records,
 - b. The applicant's practice history, and
 - c. A physical or psychological assessment of the applicant.

R4-16-201.1. Application for Renewal of License

- A. Under A.R.S. § 32-1430(A), an individual licensed under A.R.S. Title 32, Chapter 13, shall renew the license every other year on or before the licensee's birthday.
- B. To renew a license, a licensee shall submit the following information on an application form available on request from the Board and on the Board's website:
1. The licensee's full name, license number, business and home addresses, primary e-mail address, and business and home telephone numbers;
 2. Identification of changes to medical specialties and fields of practice;
 3. A statement of whether, since the time of last license issuance, the licensee:
 - a. Has had an application for medical licensure denied or rejected by another state or province licensing board and if so, an explanation;
 - b. Has had any disciplinary or rehabilitative action taken against the licensee by another licensing board, including other health professions and if so, an explanation;
 - c. Has had any disciplinary action, restriction, or limitation taken against the licensee by any program or health care provider and if so, an explanation;
 - d. Has been subject to discipline resulting in a medical license being revoked, suspended, limited, cancelled during an investigation, restricted, or voluntarily surrendered, or resulting in probation or entry into a consent agreement or stipulation and if so, an explanation;
 - e. Has had hospital privileges revoked, denied, suspended, or restricted and if so, an explanation (do not report if the licensee's hospital privileges were suspended due to failure to complete hospital records and reinstated after no more than 90 days);

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- f. Has been subjected to disciplinary action including censure, practice restriction, suspension, sanction, or removal from practice by an agency of the state or federal government and if so, an explanation;
 - g. Has had the authority to prescribe, dispense, or administer medications limited, restricted, modified, denied, surrendered, or revoked by a federal or state agency as a result of disciplinary or other adverse action and if so, an explanation;
 - h. Has been found guilty or entered into a plea of no contest to a felony, a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or an alcohol or drug-related offense in any state and if so, an explanation; and
 - i. Has failed the SPEX;
4. A statement of whether the licensee understands and complies with the medical records and recordkeeping requirements in A.R.S. §§ 32-3211 and 12-2297;
 5. A statement of whether the licensee has completed at least 40 hours of CME as required under A.R.S. § 32-1434 and R4-16-102, including the hour of CME required under R4-16-102(A)(1);
 6. A statement of whether the licensee requests that the license be inactivated or cancelled; and
 7. A statement of whether the licensee completed a training unit prescribed by the Board regarding the requirements of A.R.S. Title 32, Chapter 13 and this Chapter.
- C. Additionally, the licensee shall answer the following confidential question:
1. Whether the licensee currently has a medical condition that impairs the licensee's ability to practice medicine in a competent, ethical, and professional manner;
 2. If the answer to subsection (C)(1) is yes:
 - a. Provide an explanation of the medical condition; and
 - b. If currently practicing under a non-confidential monitoring agreement with a licensing board in another state, attach a copy of the non-confidential monitoring agreement to the application; ~~and~~.
- D. To renew a license, a licensee shall submit the following with the required application form:
1. If the document submitted under R4-16-201(C)(3) was a limited form of work authorization issued by the federal government, evidence that the licensee's presence in the U.S. continues to be authorized under federal law;
 2. The renewal fee specified under R4-16-205 and, if applicable, the penalty fee for late renewal; and
 3. An attestation that all information submitted is correct.

R4-16-201.2. Application for Licensure by Universal Recognition

- A.** An applicant who meets the requirements specified under A.R.S. § 32-4302 for a license by universal recognition shall submit to the Board:
1. An application form, which is available on the Board's website;
 2. A list of all states in which the applicant is currently and has been licensed for at least one year and certification from the licensing states that the applicant's license is in good standing with no open investigation;
 3. Proof of Arizona residency or military form 2058;
 4. A statement of whether the applicant:
 - a. Has ever entered into a consent agreement or stipulation regarding a medical license; or
 - b. Has been convicted as an adult of a crime, including any conviction that was set aside or expunged, and if so, attach court records showing the disposition of all convictions.
- B.** Additionally, an applicant for licensure by universal recognition shall submit to the Board:
1. Documentation listed under A.R.S. § 41-1080(A) showing the applicant's presence in the U.S. is authorized under federal law;
 2. A full set of fingerprints and the processing charge specified in R4-16-205;
 3. A copy of a government-issued photo identification;
 4. A statement whether the applicant completed a training unit prescribed by the Board regarding the requirements of A.R.S. Title 32, Chapter 13 and this Chapter; and
 5. The fee specified under R4-16-205.
- C.** To renew a license issued by universal recognition, the licensee shall follow R4-16-201.1.

R4-16-201.3. Application for Expedited Licensure Under the IMLC

- A.** The definitions at A.R.S. § 32-3241, Section (2) apply to this Section.
- B.** To apply for an expedited license under the IMLC, a physician licensed in Arizona shall:
1. Submit an application and required fee to the Interstate Commission through the Interstate Commission's website; and
 2. Submit to the Board through the Board's website:
 - a. A full set of fingerprints for a background check and the fingerprint-processing charge specified in R4-16-205; and
 - b. Upon request, documentation verifying eligibility under A.R.S. § 32-3241, Section (2)(11) and Section (4).
- C.** If a physician licensed in Arizona is qualified under A.R.S. § 32-3241 and passes the background check, the Interstate Commission shall issue a letter of qualification to the physician and all member states in which the physician seeks to practice medicine. To practice medicine in a member state other than Arizona, the Arizona-licensed physician shall comply with the requirements of the other member state.
- D.** A physician licensed in a member state other than Arizona who has a letter of qualification from the Interstate Commission may apply to practice medicine in Arizona by submitting through the Interstate Commission's website, an application and the fee specified in R4-16-205.
- E.** A physician who is qualified under A.R.S. § 32-3241, Section (7) may renew an expedited license by submitting through the Interstate Commission's website a renewal application and the required fee.

R4-16-204. Repealed Transitional Training Permit

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- A.** A medical graduate who is qualified under A.R.S. § 32-1432.04(A) may apply for a transitional training permit by submitting to the Board:
 - 1. An application form, which is available on the Board's website;
 - 2. Documentation listed under A.R.S. § 41-1080(A) showing the applicant's presence in the U.S. is authorized under federal law;
 - 3. A copy of a government-issued photo identification; and
 - 4. The fee specified under R4-16-205.
- B.** An applicant under subsection (A) shall have the following submitted to the Board, electronically or in hard copy, by ECFMG, Veri-doc, or FCVS:
 - 1. Official transcript or other authentication of graduation from a school of medicine;
 - 2. A statement or letter from an internship or residency program confirming non-acceptance into or non-completion of the internship or residency program. If the letter is about non-completion of the internship or residency program, the letter shall indicate whether the non-completion related to disciplinary action; and
 - 3. Verification of successful completion of USMLE Step 1 and 2.
- C.** A transitional training permit issued to an applicant under subsection (A) is valid for one year. The permittee may renew the permit for a maximum of two additional one-year periods if the permittee remains unselected for an internship or residency program.
- D.** As specified under A.R.S. § 32-1432.04(K), during each transitional training year, a permittee shall participate in at least 60 hours of continuing medical education approved by the Board. Continuing medical education approved by the Board is specified in R4-16-102(B).
- E.** As specified under A.R.S. § 32-1432.04(C), a permittee shall function only under the supervision of a qualified physician within the setting of an eligible entity, both of which are responsible for all aspects of the performance of the permittee.
- F.** Before supervising a permittee, a qualified physician shall provide the Board with notice of an agreement to serve as a supervising qualified physician. The qualified physician shall provide the notice using a form available on the Board's website.

R4-16-204.1 Dental Anesthesia Registration

- A.** Before administering general anesthesia and sedation in a dental office or clinic, a physician who is qualified under A.R.S. § 32-1403(A)(12) shall register with the Board. To register with the Board, the qualified physician shall submit to the Board:
 - 1. An application form, which is available on the Board's website;
 - 2. An attestation that the physician successfully completed residency training in anesthesiology; and
 - 3. Information regarding post-graduate training including the name and address of the institution at which training was completed.
- B.** A physician who registers under subsection (A) is not required to renew the registration. There is no fee to register.
- C.** Under A.R.S. § 32-1459, a physician is required to report to the Board within seven business days any death or emergency incident occurring in a dental office or clinic during the administration of or recovery from general anesthesia or sedation. Under A.R.S. § 32-1401, failure to make the required report is unprofessional conduct.

R4-16-205. Fees and Charges

- A.** As specifically authorized under A.R.S. §§ 32-1432.04, 32-1436(A), 32-3241, or 32-4302, the Board establishes and shall collect the following fees:

 - 4. Application to reactivate an inactive license, \$500;
 - 5. Locum tenens registration, \$350;
 - 6. Annual registration of an approved internship, residency, clinical fellowship program, or short-term residency program, or a transitional training permit, \$50;
 - 7. Annual teaching license at an approved school of medicine or at an approved hospital internship, residency, or clinical fellowship program, \$250;
 - 8. Five-day teaching permit at an approved school of medicine or at an approved hospital internship, residency, or clinical fellowship program, \$100;
 - 9. Initial registration to dispense drugs and devices, \$200;
 - 10. Annual renewal to dispense drugs and devices, \$150;
 - 11. Penalty fee for late renewal of an active license, \$350; and
 - 12. Application for temporary license, \$250.
- B.** Under the specific authority provided by A.R.S. § 36-3606(A)(3), the Board establishes and shall collect the following fee to register as an out-of-state health care provider of telehealth services: \$500.
- C.** The fees specified in subsections (A) and (B) are nonrefundable unless A.R.S. §§ 32-1436(C) or 41-1077 applies.
- D.** As specifically authorized under A.R.S. § 32-1436(B), the Board establishes the following charges for the services listed:
 - 1. Processing fingerprints to conduct a criminal background check, \$50;
 - 2. Providing a duplicate license, \$50;
 - 3. Verifying a license, \$10 per request;
 - 4. Providing a copy of records, documents, letters, minutes, applications, and files, \$1 for the first three pages and 25¢ for each additional page;
 - 5. Providing a copy of annual allopathic medical directory, \$30; and

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6. Providing an electronic medium containing public information about licensed physicians, \$100.

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 49-305, the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (Department) maintains a Groundwater Protection List (GWPL) composed of agricultural use pesticides and active ingredients that have the potential to pollute groundwater. The statute requires the Department to place a pesticide identified under A.R.S. § 49-303(C)(2) and (3) on the GWPL, and to regulate the use of the pesticide if the pesticide is intended for application to, or injection into the soil by ground-based application equipment or chemigation, or the label of the pesticide requires or recommends that the application be followed within 72 hours by flood or furrow irrigation.

2026 Groundwater Protection List

The GWPL is a list of agricultural use pesticide active ingredients that have the potential to pollute groundwater. An agricultural use pesticide active ingredient is placed on the GWPL for any of the following reasons: 1) it fails to comply with the established specific numeric values, 2) the environmental fate assessment indicates potential to leach to groundwater, or 3) an active ingredient or degradation product has been detected in groundwater consistent with established testing requirements.

Pursuant to A.A.C. R18-6-301, the Department is publishing the 2026 GWPL. The 2025 GWPL contained 107 active ingredients; the 2026 GWPL would add one active ingredient. The 2026 GWPL will become effective on December 1, 2026, in accordance with R18-6-301(A)(3) and will be posted on the agency's website at: <http://www.azdeq.gov/arizona-pesticide-groundwater-quality-protection-program>
